Attendance

This year, we have decided to reinstate the Attendance Award Scheme, which recognises the achievements of those children who have attended school every morning and afternoon during the whole term.

As a school, we set our own annual targets for attendance and our target this year is 97%. Certificates for the Autumn term 2020 (2nd September to 18th December) will be emailed to parents after school today and are explained below.

Gold Award - for any child with attendance of 100% Silver Award - for any child with attendance of 98% - 99.9% Bronze Award - for any child with attendance of 97% - 97.9% Congratulations to all those children who receive a certificate. If your child has not received an Attendance Award this term, perhaps that is something they could aspire to during the Spring 2021 term and beyond!

As set out in our Attendance Policy, once the COVID pandemic has passed and does not have significant impact on attendance, it is the school's intention to send "Traffic Light Letters" to all parents on a termly/half termly basis in order to keep parents informed about attendance levels. These letters will indicate the following:

Green Letter = Good Attendance, Well done (100 to 96%) Amber Letter = Attendance Below Target, Improvement Required (95.9 to 92%) Red Letter = Red Alert, Pupil Progress at Risk (below 92%)

Please also be aware that if you have ordered toast for your child for the Spring term (4th January to 26th March) payment must be made before 3rd January to ensure that your child receives toast on the first day back.

Parking

Thank you for your support in our efforts to improve parking around school this week. Clearing the 'hammer-head' at the top of Warton Place has seemed to make the area safer for pedestrians. Thank you.

By way of reminder:

- Please do not park across neighbours' driveways
- Please do not park near the corner of Walgarth Drive and Collingwood Drive, especially on the zigzag lines.
- Please do not park or wait in the 'hammer head' at the school end of Warton Place.

Walk to School Initiative 2021

In the New Year we are taking part in a national 'walk to school' initiative. We did a baseline survey with the children this week. 166 said they come to school in a car. That means a significant amount of traffic for a short period of time at the start and end of days. 52 said they walked. We would obviously like to increase the amount of walkers. One way of doing this will be to promote the idea of *park and stride* – to park in a space 10 minutes walk from the school. Watch this space!

Nursery Pupils/Primary School Admissions: If your child is in their last year of pre-school/nursery you can now apply for their primary school place at: https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/

It's quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. **VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in school.** If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

The closing date for primary applications for September 2020 is 15 January 2021.

Please remember that admissions to St Mary's, or any Catholic primary schools, also require the completion of the separate supplementary information form (SIF).

Free School Meals – Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants –other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

1. Your child <u>will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6</u> and beyond

2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible?

Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809

It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

- Name
- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone.
