# THE ARCHDIOCESE BUILDING FUND & MONTHLY LOTTERY

As a Catholic Voluntary Aided School we are required to make a 10% contribution towards funding the major repairs to our school building. This amount is collected by means of a levy paid to the Archdiocese Schools Building Fund. Currently the cost of this is approximately £1,560 per year.

St Mary's school levy has always been a voluntary contribution in the form of the School Development Draw - a monthly lottery.

There are approximately 160 families and 38 staff at St Mary's. A voluntary contribution of £1.00 a month (£12.00 per year) would help cover the cost of the levy and the lottery prize fund. All contributors participate in the monthly draw and we award prizes of £10 per month, with a special draw in July for a prize of £25. Contributors can be parents, carers, aunties, uncles, grandparents orstaff - all we ask is that they are over 18 years of age.

Payment can be made for each entry for either a £12 lump sum or £1 per month by setting up a standing order with their bank. More than one entry can be purchased. They will then be allocated a number per entry and drawn from a hat each month to win either £10 or a £25 prize in July.

#### Mobile phone agreement

I am exploring the possibility of seeking a voluntary agreement amongst our families to agree not to give smartphones to their children until they leave primary school. I realise that this be too late for some of our older children and I realise that not every parent/ carer will agree.

However, I think it is something worth exploring as it might go in some way to promote the children's mental health and wellbeing. I was prompted to consider this by a very powerful letter I received recently from one of our current Y6 parents who noted a big change in their child's wellbeing as a result of being given a smart phone. This parent also directed me to the May edition of our online safety newsletter with an article on a smartphone free childhood.

### Smartphone Free Childhood

Smartphone Free Childhood is a parent-led movement whose mission is to protect children from the dangers of using smartphones too young.



### The Wednesday Word

### Free School Meals, Pupil Premium and School Budget

Our school budget, like most school budgets, is becoming increasingly stretched by the rising costs of goods and services. There is a source of funding that we think our school could be possibly missing out on. It is called **pupil premium** funding. Schools receive this money for each child that is entitled to the **free school meals** benefit (this is something different to infant free school meals).

The school may be missing out on this funding because it does not receive it automatically. It requires parents/ carers to apply for it and many of us may not even realise they we are entitled to this benefit.

To confuse matters further, all children in reception, year 1 and year 2 are entitled to universal infant free school meals but this is different to free school meals as it does not bring in pupil premium funding for school. Parents of children in the infants may be entitled to free school meals in addition to universal infant free school meals.

# What can parents/ carers do to help?

Therefore we would like to ask all of our parents/ carers from reception to Year 6 to consider whether they might meet the criteria for free school meals for their child(ren). This could help to ensure that the school does not miss additional pupil premium funding.

There is a simple way to check to see if your child(ren) may be entitled to free school meals. It is accessed through Lancashire County Council and it is a very quick, straightforward process.
