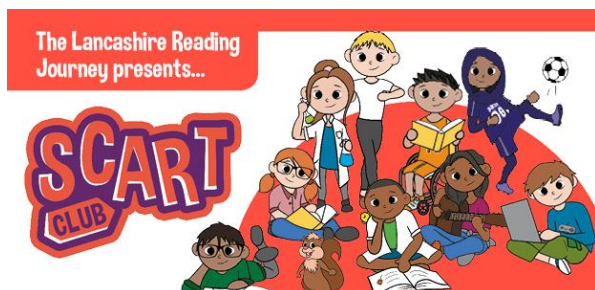
Holiday Hunger - Packed lunches for families in the School Holidays

SCART Club Chorley Library Summer Reading Challenge

Lancashire Reading Journey presents The SCART Club.



Children across Lancashire are invited to take part in this summer's Lancashire Reading Journey.

Lancashire Library Service will be launching their Summer Reading programme on **Saturday 29 June**. This year the scheme is called the SCART Club and children will be invited to sign up at any

Lancashire Library, for free.

SCART Club stands for Science, Culture, Active, Reading and Technology and 11 characters have been created as members of the club; 10 boys and girls and the club's mascot SCART Squirrel. Children from 5 years to 12 years old are invited to come and discover these new characters by taking on the challenge at their local library.

This summer the challenge is to collect all 5 SCART subjects. Each subject has tasks set by our club members, complete two tasks to unlock the subject and collect your sticker. For each subject one of the tasks must be reading related.

By finishing all 5 subjects children will be rewarded with a cool prize and certificate!

There'll be **lots of activities** taking place across all our libraries over the summer weeks, plus plenty of ideas to keep you entertained. So make sure you visit from the 29 June and join the SCART Club!

Past pupil successes

It's interesting to find out how past pupils are progressing in sport. Well, three of our past pupils represented Lancashire to compete against other elite athletes in last week's prestigious English Schools Athletics Association 2019 Track & Field Championship at the Alexander Stadium in Birmingham. Imogen B (Y9) progressed to the girls' 800m semi-final, Liam B came 6th in the boys' 800m final and Kian D came first in the senior boys' 3000m race (a race previously won by Sir Mo Farrar).

Free School Meals – Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants –other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply. **Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?**

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

1. Your child will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 and beyond
2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)

- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible? Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809**

It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

- Name
- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone.
