2024 SCHOOL ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES – PRIMARY AND SECONDARY



There will be an open evening event on **<u>Thursday 7th November</u>** at 6pm for parents interested in a place for their child in our reception class for September 2024. More details will follow.

Primary School Admissions September 2025: If your child is in their last year of pre-school/nursery you can now apply for their primary school place at: <u>https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/starting-primary-school/</u> for a September 2025 start.

It is quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. **VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in a school**. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

School places are not allocated on a first come, first served basis. All applications received up to the closing date are given equal priority, but if you miss the deadline, a late application may reduce your chance of getting your preference of school. The national closing date for primary applications is **15 January 2025**. Between now and 15th January all applications are processed and all preferences are considered against the school's published admissions policy for school year 2024 – 2025 <u>https://www.chorleystmarys.lancs.sch.uk/our-school/admissions</u>

It's quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. **VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in school.** If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application. The arrangements for the transfer of pupils to secondary schools in September 2025 will, as far as possible, conform to the following timetable. The deadline for applications is **Thursday 31**st **October**, which is during our half term break.

Parking

By way of a reminder at the start of the school year, I would appreciate your cooperation in parking safely and considerately at drop-off and pick-up times. **Please do not park on the staff carpark,** the **yellow zig zag lines** outside the gates and please do not park <u>across resident's driveways</u>. Thank you.



School entrance

At the start and end of the school day there are two entrances to the school in use: Walgarth Drive and Warton Place. The Warton place entrance can also be accessed from Hornchurch Drive via the alleyway that runs parallel to the staff car park. <u>Please do not use the path in the staff car park</u> <u>entrance.</u> This may only be used during the school day when the other entrances are locked.

Parentkind

An update on Penalty Charge Notices issued for unauthorised absence

These changes came into effect on 19 August 2024.

- Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19 August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.
- Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice **must** be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions).
- Only penalty notices issued for absences taking place after 19 August 2024 will count towards the above thresholds.
