Dear Parents and Carers,

First Holy Communion - Sunday 16th June - Trinity Sunday

For a short moment there was a break in the rain last Sunday as our Y4s were receiving the Sacrament of the Eucharist for the first time in Church. It was a beautiful occasion and a truly special day which I am sure will live long in the children's memories. PTFA Summer Fair -Y6s to man their enterprise stalls if possible.


