

Dear parents and carers,

Road safety at Walgarth Drive and Collingwood Road at Drop-off and Pick-up times

A number of parents have spoken to me about their concerns about children's safety at pick-up and drop-off times. They tell me that this is being put at risk because of parking at the junction of Collingwood Rd and Walgarth Road. I went up to take a look yesterday morning and spoke with the crossing patrol warden.

She told me the issue is at its most acute when cars park on both sides of Walgarth Drive between the junction and the zigzag lines or on the corner of Collingwood. This narrows the two lanes to one on Walgarth and reduces the crossing warden's view of traffic and drivers' view of her. See image below:



She also mentioned some parents/ carers are dropping children off at the opposite side of the road to school and allowing children to run across. She has told me that there have been a number of scary near misses, in this regard.

Therefore, to keep the children as safe as possible, I am requesting two things:

- 1. Please do not park between the zigzag lines and the junction. If we can do this, it will improve visibility around the junction.
- 2. Please use the crossing to cross the children, please don't be tempted to cross further up.

2024 SCHOOL ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES – PRIMARY AND SECONDARY

Primary School Admissions September 2025: If your child is in their last year of pre-school/nursery you can now apply for their primary school place at: https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/starting-primary-school/ for a September 2025 start.

It is quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. **VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in a school**. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

School places are not allocated on a first come, first served basis. All applications received up to the closing date are given equal priority, but if you miss the deadline, a late application may reduce your chance of getting your preference of school. The national closing date for primary applications is **15 January 2025**. Between now and 15th January all applications are processed and all preferences are considered against the school's published admissions policy for school year 2024 – 2025 https://www.chorleystmarys.lancs.sch.uk/our-school/admissions

Tax-free childcare

One of our governors shared some information with me last year to pass on to parents and carers - here is a reminder, in case your circumstances have changed.:

You can get up to £500 every 3 months (up to £2,000 a year) for each of your children to help with the costs of childcare. This goes up to £1,000 every 3 months if a child is disabled (up to £4,000 a year). For every £8 you pay into this account, the government will pay in £2 to use to pay your provider.

You can get Tax-Free Childcare at the same time as 30 hours free childcare if you're eligible for both. You can use Tax-Free Childcare for: childminders, nurseries and nannies and after school clubs and play schemes.

An update on Penalty Charge Notices issued for unauthorised absence

These changes came into effect on 19 August 2024.

- Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19 August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.
- Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice **must** be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions).
- Only penalty notices issued for absences taking place after 19 August 2024 will count towards the above thresholds.
