

The calculation for Easter is a bit different, so our Easters may not always coincide. So far they have had electricity, but they fear Russian attacks again on the Ukrainian electricity grid, as Putin tries to freeze them into submission. The number of brave young men dying on the battlefront is heartbreaking. Please continue to pray for Bishop Hryhoriy and his people, also that they will receive the necessary and promised aid they need from the USA and the West. Fr Marsden sent out £6500 (7400 euros) to Bishop Hryhoriy in relief for refugees etc this week, from collections here, at Anderton and at Withnell, and other donations. Two Saturdays ago he was asked to bless two more MEDEVAC (medical evacuation) vehicles bought by **Chorley Aid to Ukraine**, to rescue wounded soldiers and get them quickly to hospital. Volunteers drove them out to Ukraine. Thank you to all who support the Ukrainian people in their struggle for independence and nationhood.


