Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. **ST DAVID OF WALES (DEWI SANT)** c.500–589, bishop of Mynyw (now St Davids), and the patron saint of Wales. His mother was Non and his grandfather Ceredig ap Cunedda, king of Ceredigion. Born probably at Henfynyw (Vetus-Menevia) in Ceredigion. He became renowned as a teacher and preacher, founding monastic settlements and churches in Wales, Dumnonia (Cornwall / Devon), and Brittany. St David's Cathedral stands on the site of the monastery he founded in the Glyn Rhosyn valley of Pembrokeshire. Around 550, he attended the Synod of Llandewi Brefi, where as he spoke, the ground on which he stood is reputed to have risen up to form a small hill. A white dove, which became his emblem, was seen settling on his shoulder. His eloquence in opposing Pelagianism caused his fellow monks to elect him primate of the region, and Dubricius retired.

David's monastic Rule prescribed that monks had to pull the plough themselves without draught animals, and must drink only water and eat only bread with salt and herbs, no meat and no beer. The monks spent their evenings in prayer, reading and writing. No personal possessions were allowed: even to say "my book" was considered an offence. David's last words were: "'Be joyful, keep the faith, and do the little things that you have heard and seen me do."

Fasting depends on the individual. If you have health issues and cannot fast, then it



would be wrong to encourage fasting. We omit eating meat on Fridays or something else if you are vegetarian or vegan. Fasting has to be taken sensibly and please do not over do it. **Almsgiving**, depends on your purse. You will find the Lenten Box near St Anthony's statue. In these days of high energy costs and a significant increase cost for basic foods, the Lenten Box is there if you can spare to give something. **Prayer**, at home or in church, going to work or hoovering at home – it is up to you to give time to the Lord and

accompany Him on this Lenten Journey before Holy Week comes.

Stations of the Cross will be prayed each Friday at **11.30 am in church** so you don't have to come out into the cold dark weather in the evenings. **Please dress warmly. Sundays at 15.00** there will be a **Holy Hour**, to be peaceful with the Lord and pray for the causes in your heart. I encourage you to leave your couches and TVs and come to the Lord and offer Him your time in anticipation of His offering to Mankind. Evening Prayer at **15.40 and a short Benediction** concludes the Holy Hour.

Each day (except Thursdays) **Holy Mass** is available for you. Please make a special effort to receive the Lord in the Holy Eucharist during Lent. **Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament** is on Tuesday and Fridays following Mass. **Reconciliation / Confessions** are available each Saturday at **16.15 – 16.45**. If you cannot make that time, there are opportunities for Confessions after weekday Masses. Please let Fr Marsden know in advance. **Volunteering to help in the church**, is always most welcome. The cleaning ladies meet Thursdays at 09.30 together with the gentlemen who look after the grounds. Your help would be very appreciated.
