

Attendance cards will be looked at after Easter for each Yr 4 child and the children in other communities who are joining us for this special day.



Today, we process with Jesus into Jerusalem. Jesus is going up to the heights, to the top, to be lifted high on the Cross, offering Himself to the Father as a sacrificial lamb for us and for our salvation. Holy Week is the week in which the earthly life of Jesus Our Lord and Saviour comes to a climax when on Good Friday He dies on the Cross for us and on Easter Sunday, rises gloriously from the tomb. All the events we hear about in the Gospel accounts of the Passion, play out this week. Today Jesus enters Jerusalem. On Monday, He goes to Bethany where with costly oil, Mary will anoint His feet. On Tuesday, we see Jesus at supper, troubled that one of The

Twelve will betray Him and another deny Him. On Wednesday, Judas enters a deal to hand Him over. Then on Thursday, we begin the Triduum, the Sacred Three Days: The Mass of the Lord's Supper followed by the Agony on the Garden, the celebration of the Crucifixion on Good Friday, the Lord's descent into hell on Holy Saturday and the glory of the Resurrection at the Easter Vigil.

Fourthly, the excellency of the divine charity and bounty therein manifested, that we may love him more fervently. Fifthly, the convenience of the mystery, that we may be drawn to admiration of it. Lastly, the multiplicity of virtues of our blessed Savior which did shine in this stupendous mystery, that we may partly imitate and partly admire them." **–St Peter of Alcántara**
