WELCOME ONCE AGAIN TO BISHOP HRYHORIY KOMAR, who is here for twelve days over Holy Week and Easter, returning to Drohobych, Ukraine on Friday 5th April. The Eastern-rite Easter is not until 5th May, because it is always after the Jewish Passover, this year 21-28 April. A welcome rest from air-raid sirens and electricity power cuts for him! Thank you for all your generosity for Ukraine and its people, and for all your prayers. The Archbishop asked Bishop Hryhoriy to say a few words at the end of the Chrism Mass in the Metropolitan Cathedral, and this is what he said:

"I thank you very much for this chance to pray with you. The Divine Liturgies of Holy Week which portray the sufferings of Christ recall for me our reality in Ukraine.

Each day we experience the tragedy of the ruining of our country, our cities; each day we look into the face of death, and unfortunately so far we have no clear perspectives as to when this all will finish.

Therefore we have to cope with this situation of the deep pain of our people, and often we feel helpless in the face of all this.

This Liturgy gives us the certainty that the Lord receives in himself the suffering and the pain of the injured and crippled, of the Ukrainian children and orphans who have been deported, of widows, of fathers who have lost their sons in war, refugees, and all those whom this war, unleashed by the Russian regime, has wounded or killed.

Taking this opportunity to address you all, I beg for your solidarity and your prayers. Christ conquered death. May the power of his Resurrection bring victory over evil, and a just peace to Ukraine."

Christians, to the Paschal Victim offer sacrifice and praise.

The sheep are ransomed by the Lamb; and Christ, the undefiled, hath sinners to his Father reconciled. Death with life contended: combat strangely ended!
