

THE FEAST OF SAINT CATHERINE OF SIENA falls this

<u>Monday 29th April</u>. (pictured). Born the 24th of 25 children, from an early age she experienced spiritual visions. Angered by her decision not to marry, her parents treated her like a servant. In 1365, she joined the Dominican tertiaries, took the habit and remained at home in prayer for three years. Jesus joined her to Himself in a 'mystical marriage' and bade her express her love through action. She attended to plague victims, brokered peace between warring factions in Italy and dictated her Dialogue, a conversation between the soul and God. She died at the age of



33. She is buried in the church of Santa Maria Sopra Minerva in Rome Catherine was the first woman and first layperson to be named a Doctor at the Church. She is a patron saint of Italy and as a key contributor to European culture, Pope St. John Paul II in 1999 declared her a co-patron of Europe.

Next Monday, let us pray for the peoples of the European continent and for a just conclusion to the war in Ukraine.
