### CAN YOU EXPLAIN THE MOST HOLY TRINITY?

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity is celebrated on the Sunday following Pentecost Sunday. The Blessed Trinity is the mystery of one God in three Divine Persons, and it is the central mystery of our Catholic Faith. We call it a 'mystery' because it cannot be understood by reason alone. God the Father, Source of all that is, seen and unseen, and His Divine Word, the Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, who died on the Cross for our salvation, breathe forth their mutual love which is the Holy Spirit. The three co-equal Divine Persons have their own identities, but together are the One God. No analogy is adequate, but when explaining the Holy Trinity to young people we can use the example of an egg, look at the compound on an egg. Yolk, white and shell all distinctive in their identities and yet are an egg.

God the Father loves all His children and like a good parent is always there for us in joy and in sorrow. The mistakes that we make are our own fault, however, God is there for us with unconditional love and understanding. If we do something sinful, we can be reconciled to the Father by the Sacrament of Confession and saying sorry by doing penance.

Our Blessed Lord Jesus Christ, lived a fully human life even in His divinity, among ordinary people and for 33 years led a simple life earning money as a carpenter and was taught by St Joseph. He died in pain and sorrow on the Cross for the sins of mankind. His love and Teachings show us how to love our neighbour as ourselves and how to try and live good lives to reach the ultimate goal – heaven. Jesus, I trust in you.

The Holy Spirit is active in all the Seven Sacraments, especially during each Mass at the point of transubstantiation – the miracle of bread and wine becoming the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. This takes place by the power of the Holy Spirit. When we pray – alone or in groups – the Holy Spirit is there understanding our petitions. By the Holy Spirit, the Word was made flesh with Our Blessed Lady, John the Baptist the Herald of the Lord prepared the way for Jesus and the Holy Spirit guided the Prophets and the Apostles, Our Blessed Lord in His moment of agony and death was sustained by the Holy Spirit and strengthened with love. We, by receiving the Sacraments in our daily lives are encouraged and made stronger in our Faith.
