ST MARIA GORETTI 16 October 1890 – 6 July 1902) was an Italian and one of the youngest saints to be canonized She was born into a farming family. Her father died when she was nine, and the family had to share a house with another family, the Serenellis. She took over household duties while her mother and siblings worked in the fields. One afternoon, Alessandro, the Serenellis' 20-year-old son, made sexual advances to her. He had done this several times before. When she again refused to submit to him, he stabbed her 14 times. She was taken to the hospital, but she died forgiving him. He was arrested, convicted, and jailed. During imprisonment, he repented. After 27 years, he

was released from prison and visited her mother to beg forgiveness, which she granted. He later became a lay brother in a Capuchin monastery and died in 1970 aged 87. Maria was beatified in 1947 and canonized in 1950. She is especially venerated in the Congregation of the Passionists. Ora pro nobis.

TODAY WE CELEBRATE the great solemnity of St Peter and St Paul - transferred from its usual date of 29th June and otherwise a Holy Day of Obligation. "Peter, a poor fisherman, was called by Christ to lead and care for Christ's entire flock: "Feed my sheep!" (John 21: 7). It was Peter who received a vision confirming that the Good News was to be preached to those the Jews considered unclean, the pagan Gentiles (cf. Acts 10: 9-16). It is said that he was a bit fiery and short tempered and could be guite stubborn. Jesus saw in Peter good leadership qualities that were empowered by the Holy Spirit. Peter was the first to preach after Pentecost Day. He dropped everything and followed Jesus.

Paul, the former Pharisee, carried out his mission under very difficult circumstances. At the beginning, he was the ruthless and relentless persecutor of the Christians making it his life's work to pursue and eliminate them wherever he

found them. He watched impassively and approvingly as Stephen was summarily stoned to death by a crowd, even holding the tunics of the murderers while they set to

their task. One day he had a conversion on the road to Damascus which changed his whole life. He became a prolific letter writer, as we hear in the Second Readings during Mass. During his preaching, he was flogged, beaten, stoned, shipwrecked and attacked by brigands (cf. 2 Cor 11: 24-27). Both Peter and Paul ended their ministries in Rome, around the year 64 AD. Tradition has it that Peter was crucified upside down and Paul was beheaded. What unites Peter and Paul is Jesus - His love for them and their love for Him.

God calls all sorts of people to serve his purposes and build his Church. It is comforting to know that Peter and Paul, though giants of the Church, were ordinary fallible people like you and me, with their weakness and faults as well as their strengths and gifts. The fact is that God can use us however imperfect, sinful and unworthy we are, to carry on his work today, the same work that Peter and Paul began and gave their lives to. It is never too late to give our lives to God wholeheartedly to share in the work of building and serving the Church to which we belong, and in particular to consider how we might use our gifts to serve the Church here in our parish.
