We will be making a collection for Bishop Gregory Komar's people in the diocese of Drohobych this weekend and next. For the winter, people need fuel for electricity generators and wood and coal for heating. Many Ukrainians have been driven from the eastern towns and cities by the Russian bombs, missile strikes and artillery. Refugees have moved westwards away from the battle frontline and closer to the Polish border. Many who are ill or frail stay in that area, rather than crossing abroad. The elderly, women and children are being housed in diocesan buildings, churches and meeting halls. The diocese organises 700 meals three times per day from the seminary. The winter is harsh in Eastern Europe. Temperatures are usually +5 = =5 but can fall down to -20C. Please help Bishop Gregory if you can.
