You have forgotten about the Last Supper, Crucifixion and Resurrection of My beloved Son, Jesus. Perhaps you should reflect on this and spare 45 minutes attending Sunday Mass? I will listen to you and your prayers. You can receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist and you can sit down, slow down and find some peace in My House; The House of God - you will be welcome.



To obtain it you must: devoutly visit a cemetery and pray for the departed, be detached from all sin, receive Holy Communion, and pray for the Pope's intentions. You can apply the indulgence to loved ones or souls with no one to pray for them. A partial indulgence can still be obtained even if not all the conditions are satisfied. Alternatively, from 12.00 on 1st Nov and through All Souls' Day, visit a church and recite the Our Father and the Creed, and the prayer Eternal Rest, and other conditions as above. Indulgences do not forgive sins, but they do deal with the remission of the temporal punishment due to sins.

ST MARY'S HAS BEEN DESIGNATED A PILGRIM CHURCH FOR 2025

Pope Francis has announced that next year, 2025, will be a Jubilee Year – an event that happens every 25 years. The theme for the 2025 Jubilee is "Pilgrims of Hope", hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, and a climate crisis. Our hope ultimately is in Jesus Christ!

The Jubilee Year runs from the opening of the Holy Door in St Peter's Basilica in Rome, on Tuesday 24 December 2024 to Epiphany 2026. Pope Francis asked that 2024 be 'A Year of Prayer' in preparation for the jubilee with a focus on the 'Our Father'.

Archbishop Malcolm McMahon will celebrate Mass for the Solemn Opening of the Jubilee Year at 11.00 at the Metropolitan Cathedral on Sunday 29 Dec 2024.

The Archbishop has asked if St Mary's and parishioners will accept the task of being a pilgrim church. There are four of these around the diocese, besides the Cathedral and the Co-Cathedral in Douglas, Isle of Man. There will be more information on how to obtain indulgences when visiting St Mary's, made available for all parishioners and visitors.

THE KIM LEADBEATER ASSISTED SUICIDE (EUTHANASIA) BILL On 29th

November, MPs will vote on the assisted suicide proposals by Kim Leadbeater MP. Let our MP, Sir Lindsay Hoyle, know your thoughts. As Speaker of The House of Commons, he cannot vote but he can hear your views. Please pray that this misguided and immoral Bill will fail. The NHS is broken at the present moment and if this Bill passes, any person over 18 yrs old can request to have their life terminated if they are terminally ill. If they cannot speak for themselves, then doctors will make the request. In time no life will be safe.
