PENSION CREDIT Up to 850,000 pensioner households may be entitled to Pension Credit, but do not claim it. Some pensioners think because they've got savings or own their home, they would not get any Pension Credit - but this is not the case. The government have asked that community leaders share this information with people. The aim is to encourage the conversation and the claim for pension credit to ensure those eligible will not also get this vital extra income, but access to the winter fuel payment too.

THE NEW LECTIONARY which contains the Scripture readings for Mass, will be introduced from Sunday 1st December, the First Sunday of Advent. The Scripture excerpts are the same, but follow the English Standard Version - Catholic Edition rather than the Jerusalem Bible for the readings, and the Abbey Psalms and Canticles for the

Responsorial Psalms. Probably the Psalm responses are where confusion might occur, since they will not be exactly the same as in our Parish Mass Books.

We are asking our parishioners to use the parish centre as much as possible for celebrations of baptisms, weddings, special anniversaries and family and friends gathering after a funeral. As one member of the meeting said, 'if you don't use it – you will lose it'. The parish centre needs your support. Thank you. If anyone would like to establish a **YOUTH GROUP**, please let Fr Marsden know. There are many good and interesting groups that can come together in the parish centre. Please have a think about it.

YOUTH SUNDAY – 24 NOVEMBER: CELEBRATING YOUNG PEOPLE IN THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH: A TIME OF PRAYER: To mark Youth Sunday, we are hosting a time of prayer, reflection and celebration at Lowe House (North Rd, St Helens, WA10 2BE) at 5pm on 24 November. We hope the evening will be an uplifting event at which we can pray for young people and those that work with them, whilst listening to different speakers offer thoughts and reflections on their work with young people. The service will end with a social time. All are welcome. Please come along to pray for our young people and hear what opportunities we offer young people across the diocese.

THE ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL: This weekend there is a message from all the bishops of England and Wales about the dangers of the Ledbetter "Assisted Suicide Bill." Nobody wants to prolong the dying process when people are in pain, and there comes a time to let our loved ones go peacefully to God. Palliative care and good hospice care are the answers to end of life treatment in difficult cases, not encouraging the patient to kill themselves. Many of us have seen the excellent care provided by St Catherine's Hospice and elsewhere.

On the notice board, at the back of the church you will find a poster details on how to contact Sir Lindsay Hoyle MP and ask him to speak out against the introduction of the Kim Leadbeater MP Suicide Bill, which will be voted on in a Second Reading at the House of Commons 29th November 2024. You can scan a QR code from the poster. Please talk to your family, friends and colleagues about this proposed Bill.

Cardinal Vincent Nichols makes three points saying: 'Be careful what you wish for. A right to die can become a duty to die. Forgetting God belittles our humanity'.

One can see that some money-minded persons might well encourage a sick relative to opt for assisted suicide, in order to save nursing home fees and to protect the money they hope to get from an inheritance. Very sick patients are often a bit confused and weak and would be susceptible to this sort of pressure from unscrupulous relatives. As the Cardinal said above, a "right to die" can be twisted into "a duty to die."
