

2024 SCHOOL ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES - PRIMARY - Deadline 15th January 2024

Primary School Admissions September 2024: If your child is in their last year of pre-school/nursery you can now apply for their primary school place at: https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/starting-primary-school/ for a September 2024 start.

It is quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. **VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in a school**. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

School places are not allocated on a first come, first served basis. All applications received up to the closing date are given equal priority, but if you miss the deadline, a late application may reduce your chance of getting your preference of school. The national closing date for primary applications is 15th January 2024. Between now and 15th January all applications are processed and all preferences are considered against the school's published admissions policy for school year 2024 – 2025 https://www.chorleystmarys.lancs.sch.uk/our-school/admissions
