POPE LEO XIV appeared on the loggia of St Peter's Basilica for his first ever Regina Coeli address on Sunday 11th May. Addressing the faithful gathered in St Peter's Square and countless others following from around the world he echoed the cry for peace of his predecessor, Pope Francis. "In today's dramatic context of a third world war fought piecemeal ... I too appeal to the powerful of the world by repeating these ever-relevant words: never again war!" He recalled, first, "the immense tragedy of the Second World War", which came to an end 80 years ago, on 8th May, "after causing 60 million deaths." Pope Leo then turned to the modern wars plaguing the world today: "I carry in my heart the suffering of the beloved Ukrainian people," he said, urging that "every effort be made to reach a true, just, and lasting peace as soon as possible. May all prisoners be freed, and may the children be returned to their families", he said. He

then turned to the ongoing humanitarian catastrophe in the Gaza Strip. "I am deeply pained by what is happening," he said. "Let the fighting cease immediately, let humanitarian aid be provided to the exhausted civilian population, and may all hostages be released". INVITATION FROM THE CATHEDRAL: The Installation of Archbishop-elect John **Sherrington** as the tenth Archbishop of Liverpool will take place in the Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King on Tuesday 27 May at 12 noon. There are still some spaces available for people to attend the Mass, but everyone attending will need a ticket. 27th May is significantly the Feast of ST AUGUSTINE OF CANTERBURY, a Catholic monk who became in 597 the "Apostle to the English". He was the prior of a monastery in Rome when Pope Gregory the Great chose him in 595 to lead a mission to Christianize King Æthelberht and his Kingdom of Kent, from Anglo-Saxon paganism. Æthelberht commanded influence over neighbouring Anglo-Saxon kingdoms, and was married ro Bertha, a Catholic Frankish princess. Before reaching Kent, the missionaries considered turning back, but Gregory urged them on, and in 597, Augustine landed on the Isle of Thanet and proceeded to Æthelberht's main town of Canterbury.

The following Easter King Æthelberht converted to Christianity, was baptised, and allowed the missionaries to preach freely, giving them land to found a monastery outside the city walls. Augustine was consecrated as a bishop and converted many of the king's subjects. Pope Gregory sent more missionaries in 601, along with encouraging letters and gifts for the churches, although attempts to persuade the native Celtic British bishops to submit to Augustine's authority failed. Roman bishops were established at London, and Rochester in 604, and a school was founded to train Anglo-Saxon priests and missionaries. Augustine died 26 May 604, being succeeded by St Laurence of Canterbury.
