



VATICAN: Mount Zvir - Litmanová is a pilgrimage place in eastern Slovakia. Pope Leo XIV approved the claims regarding the apparitions and granted a Nihil Obstat this month. The **Blessed Virgin Mary** appeared to two girls, 11year-old Ivetka Korcakova and 12-year-old Katka Ceselkova in a room in a log cabin that still stands in a meadow surrounded by forests. Our Lady was seated on a wooden bench. She introduced herself as the IMMACULATE **PURITY**. She wanted both girls and people to come to the spot to pray. The apparitions continued from 05 August 1990 to 06 August 1995 once a month on the Sunday following the first Friday in the month. At the last apparition, the Mother of God promised to remain present forever. Both during the apparitions and afterwards believers came and continue to come to the spot in large numbers. The largest gatherings are on the Sunday after the first Friday in the month. Besides the first Sundays, pilgrims from Slovakia and abroad come to the pilgrimage site every day where they can find spiritual peace and ask for God's help in their lives, give thanks for God's kindness and assistance and

place their life in the protection of the Mother of God.
