

FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS this weekend, replaces the usual Sunday 24th week of Ordinary Time. Holy Cross Catholic High School is under the patronage of the Cross so this is their patronal feast. Please remember Mr Lindley (Headteacher) his staff and all the pupils in your prayers. The youth is tomorrow 's future and we hope to hear very good results in the coming year from the school.

Origins of the Feast. It celebrates three events:

- The finding of the True Cross by Saint Helena.
- The dedication of churches built by Emperor Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary.
- The elevation of the True Cross at Hagia Sophia in Constantinople in AD 629 by the Byzantine emperor Heraclius, after it had fallen into the hands of the Persian Emperor Chosroes II in the AD 614 Sassanian conquest of Jerusalem.

About 325 AD St. Helena, already about seventy years old, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to Jerusalem in search of the holy places of Christ's life. Her son equipped her with detachments of soldiers, engineers and builders. Cooperating with Bishop Makarios of Jerusalem, St Helena gave orders to raze the Temple of Aphrodite (Venus), which had been built over the site of Jesus's tomb by the Emperor Hadrian. After the Jewish Bar Kokhba rebellion in 135 AD, Hadrian had wanted to obliterate the site and prevent Christian veneration there. Helena then built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre over the tomb. During the excavations in the cisterns beneath Calvary, workers found three crosses. Legend has it that the one on which Jesus died was identified when its touch healed a dying woman.

Helena left one-third of the Cross in Jerusalem in the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre. One-third was brought to Rome and can be seen today in the basilica of

Santa Croce in Gerusalemme (Holy Cross in Jerusalem), The final one-third was taken to Constantinople.

The Holy Cross naturally became an object of veneration. At a Good Friday celebration in Jerusalem c.382 AD, the Spanish pilgrim Egeria described how the wood was taken out of its silver container and placed on a table together with the inscription Pilate ordered placed above Jesus' head: Then "all the people pass through one by one; all of them bow down, touching the cross and the inscription, first with their foreheads, then with their eyes; and, after kissing the cross, they move on."

To this day the Eastern Churches, Catholic and Orthodox alike, celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on the September anniversary of the basilica's dedication. The feast entered the Western calendar in the seventh century after Emperor Heraclius recovered the cross from the Persians, who had carried it off in 614, fifteen years earlier. According to the story, the emperor intended to carry the cross back into Jerusalem himself but was unable to move forward until he took off his imperial garb and became a barefoot pilgrim

The Cross is our salvation and our hope and eternal life cf. John 3:14–15, "And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." If you bring Crucifixes and Crosses from your homes, Fr Marsden will bless them at the end of Mass. If someone forgets, please bring your home Crucifix/Cross to the 09.00 Mass on Monday morning.

<u>IMPORTANT INFORMATION</u>: We need to pray this week that the Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill goes no further. It is undoubtedly the most worrying Bill in decades. Please petition Our Blessed Lady with your prayers or rosaries.
