MGR CANON THOMAS STANISLAUS CRANK was a former parish priest of St Mary's from 1897 to 1932. Canon Crank replaced Canon Gordon and in 1909 Canon Crank declared that the church would be expanding and enlarging. Each parishioner was given a plan of the proposed works and within 2 weeks offers came in for 17 stained glass windows, (ranging from £150.00 each, £50 each, £15 and £10 each. Those were huge amounts of money. Marble altar rails were sponsored at a cost of £200. Also, 14 Stations of the Cross were sponsored at £15 each. The silver sanctuary lamp received an offering of £50 and the statue of our Lady of Lourdes was sponsored for £50. A new porch and window at the west end were built and transepts were increased by 25ft and arches built in. The 4 new confessionals were built where they are now. The organ gallery was lowered by 2 feet which made it look bigger. New benches were fitted, and the lights were redesigned . The two side altars were erected: Our Lady of Mount Carmel and the Sacred Heart altars, both made from Caen stone from Normandy, France. New communion rails of polished alabaster and marble were installed, and new heating and ventilation was also installed.

What you see today in the church is a result of the great generosity of the parishioners of St Mary's and the huge love and dedication of the formidable Monsignor Canon Crank. We are a Grade II Listed Building and rated very highly in commentaries by historians and architecture specialists.

Chorley Historical Association will donate a plaque in memory of Mgr Canon Crank. It will be put on the St Mary's Archway. We give thanks to God for all the people who gave generous donations, work, time and prayers for this beautiful church which we are so proud of.

OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY: In the third century, the early monastics would pray the 150 psalms (today, also known as the Divine Office) found in the scriptures. Those who could not pray the psalms prayed a 150 'Our Fathers,' also known as the poor man's breviary. The laity were given beads to help them count their prayers. In the 11th century, St Alvery began to pray 150 Hail Mary's, other Christians did the same. In the prayer, 'Hail Mary', we are reminded of both the events of the annunciation, the coming of the Messiah, and the incarnation, God becoming man, the fruit of Mary's womb. In the 13th century, St Dominic, the founder of the Dominican Order, had a vision of Mary who told him about the Rosary and showed him a set of

Rosary beads. He popularised the devotion and encouraged Christians to pray it in small groups. In the 14th century, Dominic of Prussia, developed the Joyful, Sorrowful and Glorious mysteries. In 2002, Pope John Paul II, added the 'Luminous' mysteries of the Rosary which focus on Jesus's ministry on earth.



PROMISES OF OUR LADY CONNECTED TO THE RECITATION OF THE ROSARY

- 1. Those who faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary shall receive signal graces.
- 2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.
- 3. The Rosary shall be a powerful armour against hell. It will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.
- 4. The recitation of the Rosary will cause virtue and good works to flourish. It will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of

God. It will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire of eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.

- 5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary shall not perish.
- 6. Those who recite my Rosary devoutly, applying themselves to the consideration of its sacred mysteries, shall never be conquered by misfortune. In His justice, God will not chastise them; nor shall they perish by an unprovided death, i.e., be unprepared for heaven. Sinners shall convert. The just shall persevere in grace and become worthy of eternal life.
- 7. Those who have a true devotion to the Rosary shall not die without the sacraments of the Church.
- 8. Those who faithfully recite the Rosary shall have, during their life and at their death, the light of God and the plenitude of His graces. At the moment of death, they shall participate in the merits of the saints in paradise.
- 9. I shall deliver from purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary.
- 10. The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of glory in heaven.
- 11. By the recitation of the Rosary you shall obtain all that you ask of me.
- 12. Those who propagate the holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.
- 13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire celestial court during their life and at the hour of their death.
- 14. All who recite the Rosary are my beloved children and the brothers and sisters of my only Son, Jesus Christ.
- 15. Devotion for my Rosary is a great sign of predestination.
