Dear parents/ carers,

Usually in a September newsletter, I would be telling you about all the different things that have been happening in school. By this stage last year, we had all spent time looking at the huge Arctic map, the junior classes had celebrated the start of year school Mass, we had all celebrated Harvest Mass together, we had welcomed visitors and some classes had even been on visits. It has been a lot quieter this year. But, the children are doing you proud and the teachers are really pleased with the effort and progress being made.

COVID measures in school update

Lancashire County Council have updated their advice to schools this week and so from next week, adults in school are required to wear face masks in areas outside of the classroom e.g. corridors, communal areas and so on. The children seem to take this sort of thing in their stride but for those for whom it might cause worry, we will explain what we are doing and why. Teachers and teaching assistants will not be wearing face masks in classrooms but may choose to wear visors.

Some schools are advising parents and carers at drop off/ pick up times to wear face masks. We are not asking you to do that just yet unless the advice changes. We feel that the one-way system, staggered drop off/ pick up times and the fact that parents/ carers are not gathering minimises the social contact going on. However, please feel free to wear masks at those times if you wish to, because it will not do any harm and can only do good.

Jumpers

As we progress through autumn and then into winter, we are still going to need to keep classrooms well ventilated. Doors and windows will be left open. It will be chillier in the classrooms. We've noticed some children coming to school without their jumpers and therefore wanting to wear their coats in class. It is really important that the children bring their jumpers to school – it's unlikely that they are going to get too warm in class at the moment!

Even though I mentioned that it was quieter than usual in school, Madame Russell, our French teacher in the juniors, found time to celebrate the *European Day of Languages* (26.09.20) on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons this week.

'We started with the date in Spanish, the afternoon prayer and register in French. Madame Russell has provided some activities for you to try at home if you wish to mark European Day of Langauages – see them attached to newsletter.

Remote Learning or Blended Learning

You will have no doubt heard about year groups in different schools being required to self-isolate for two weeks due to positive test results in those cohorts - you may even have experienced this yourselves in your own families with siblings or relations at other schools. You will want to know what we plan to do if, and when, this happens at St Mary's. We are in the process of finalising our plans for that form of remote or blended learning. Our plans to date are these:

- ✓ In the event of a year group having to self-isolate, our teachers have prepared two days' worth of learning for children to be doing. This will allow the class teacher to prepare work for the remaining twelve or so days. Our plan is to keep the teaching and learning going as near as is possible to what it would be like if the children were in school.
- ✓ You will all have received the half-termly curriculum newsletter.
- ✓ Weekly plans will be sent home at the start of each week of the isolation period. A plan of each day's learning will also be sent home.
- ✓ Video introductions to lessons will be given, where required.
- ✓ There will be a daily Zoom check in with the class teacher and opportunities for communication between school and home.
- ✓ Our principal platforms for the delivery of teaching and learning will be Tapestry for the Nursery and Reception classes, and SeeSaw for Y1 – Y6.
- ✓ Teachers will also be providing work for children who are self-isolating even though they have no symptoms e.g. a family member has symptoms and is awaiting a test result.

Sacramental Meeting

Mrs Kinga Gray–Grzeczynska led a meeting with the parents of children in Y4 who will be preparing to receive the sacraments of Reconciliation and of the Eucharist during the course of this school year. In spite of this period of great uncertainty, the Catechesis sessions will go ahead albeit without the parents present and they will take place at school. Thank you to Kinga and to all the parents for attending.

Open Evening Thursday 8th October

There will be a virtual Open Evening for prospective parents on the 8th October. It will take place over Zoom and details will be confirmed next week.

Parents Evening Tuesday 20th October

We are planning to do an autumn term parents' evening. We intend to do it via Zoom or via the phone. As we did this time last year, we are giving parents the option to book a 5-minute appointment with their child's teacher. Unfortunately, we cannot arrange for parents/ carers to look at the children's books.

We have found in the past that these early meetings are really just an opportunity to find out how well children are settling into their new year groups and you might already know that through other channels of communication. There is no obligation for you to book a meeting. Some parents/ carers prefer to wait for a more in-depth consultation in the spring term. The spring term parents' evening will take place over two evenings and last up to 10 minutes .

It's quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

The closing date for primary applications for September 2020 is 15 January 2021.

Please remember that admissions to St Mary's, or any Catholic primary schools, also require the completion of the separate supplementary information form (SIF).

Free School Meals – Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants –other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

1. Your child <u>will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6</u> and beyond

2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible?

Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809

It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

- Name
- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone.
