ANNUAL STATISTICS FOR ST MARY'S: Each year we are obliged to send to the Chancellor in Liverpool our statistics for the previous year. **2025:** We have **2** people preparing to enter the Catholic Faith. Last year we had: **11** baptisms, **1** reception into the faith, **32** First Holy Communions, **22** Confirmations, **nil** marriages, **15** funerals. The average weekly Mass attendance during the 'counting weeks' in autumn was **137**. **You can see that the Mass weekend attendance (was 186 in 2024) has fallen at St Mary's.** Apart from a few families, we see very few children with parents attending weekly Sunday Mass. The Little Church has stopped functioning because of this. Parents please note; if you do not attend Mass with your children, the future of this church looks uncertain.

NEWS FROM ROME: Pope Leo XIV has granted a Plenary Indulgence to all Franciscan sanctuaries in the world. The decision is linked to the opening of the 8th Centenary of the Transitus of Saint Francis, inaugurated on 10 January 2026, in Assisi, in the Basilica of Santa Maria degli Angeli. The centenary commemorates the death of Saint Francis, which occurred in 1226 at the Porziuncola in Assisi. The Decree establishes that the special Year of Saint Francis will last from 10 January 2026, to 10 January 2027.

MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE MASS

Archbishop John Sherrington will celebrate the Marriage and Family Life Mass at the Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King on Sunday 8 February 2026 at 11.00. The Mass will include the renewal of marriage vows and a special blessing for those celebrating significant anniversaries. Refreshments will be served afterwards in the Gibberd Room. FCJ PILGRIMAGE TO LINDISFARNE: Beginning on Wednesday 8 April (17:00) and concluding Sunday 12 April (14:00), the FCJ's are inviting all young adults (20's and

30's) to a walking retreat to the **Holy Island of Lindisfarne**, a tidal island off the coast of Northeast England. Walking in the footsteps of the Northern saints, the trail will include a two-day walk on **St Cuthbert's Way**, crossing the pilgrim route to the island. One day in Lindisfarne and the final day will include Mass and a visit to St Cuthbert's Shrine at Durham Cathedral. Accommodation is a **Bunkhouse** on the mainland with simple facilities, bunkbeds, an open fire and some storage heating. Each day the group will drive to the start of the walk and arrange to be collected from the end. The terrain is open countryside so good walking shoes, a backpack and waterproof jacket are essential. The group will pray together every day with some opportunities for Mass.

WHAT IS HAPPENING IN THE ARCHDIOCESE? There is some interesting information for you. Last year there were 1,137 Confirmations in the Archdiocese. We gained 2 permanent Deacons, there were 14 Priestly Jubilees, 150 RCIA candidates (people wanting to be baptised and become Catholics). There were 3,453 Adoremus Visitors, hundreds of people attended the Marriage and Life Mass 2025. 44 couples are preparing for a wedding in 2026 and 6,000 children made their First Holy Communion in the Archdiocese. The Catholic Church gained a new Pope, Leo XIV, the Archdiocese gained a new Archbishop +John Sherrington, and we saw

NINE NEW SAINTS PRONOUNCED BY POPE LEO XIV.

Blessed **Carlo Acutis** and Blessed **Pier Giorgio Frassati** were canonized as saints together on Sept. 7, 2025. Then on October 19th the following were canonised:

- Blessed **Maria Troncatti**, a Salesian nursing sister who went to Ecuador and became known as "the doctor of the jungle" among the Shuar people.
- Blessed **José Gregorio Hernández Cisneros**, a Venezuelan doctor and a Third Order Franciscan. He was known as the doctor of the poor, whom he treated for free.
- Blessed **Vincenza Maria Poloni** established the Sisters of Mercy of Verona, caring for the sick and for orphans. "The poor are our masters, let us love them and serve them as we would serve Jesus Christ himself in person."
- Blessed **Ignatius Maloyan**, Armenian Catholic bishop, murdered 1915 aged 46 during the Ottoman genocide for refusing to convert to Islam.
- Blessed **Peter To Rot**, a lay catechist from Papua New Guinea, was martyred for his faith during World War II.
- Blessed **Maria Rendiles Martínez**, a Venezuelan Catholic religious sister who founded the congregation of the Servants of Jesus of Caracas.
- Blessed **Bartolo Longo**, Italian lawyer and one-time satanist priest who converted to the Catholic Faith, renounced the devil, and became a great apostle of the Rosary, founding the shrine of the Madonna at Pompei.
