Dear parents and carers,

SS Peter and Paul Mass – Important Update

The planned SS Peter and Paul Mass at St Mary's Church on Monday has been cancelled due to Fr Marsden being unavailable. Children in Years 2 to 6 should come to school as normal and **not** go to Church, arriving in time at school for registration at 8:50am.

Although we are unable to meet at church, we will still mark this important feast day together as a school community. A special prayer and liturgy will take place during our morning assembly, giving pupils the opportunity to reflect and celebrate meaningfully.

Health & Safety – Car Park Path

A few years ago, as part of our ongoing risk assessments with an adviser, we determined that children and families should not use the car park path when arriving at or leaving school. This is due to the unacceptable risk created by children and vehicles mixing within the car park area.

We therefore ask all parents, carers and pupils to use the ginnel that runs parallel to the car park, entering and exiting via the Warton Place entrance at the start and end of the school day.

School gates are locked 10-15 minutes after the school closing time of 3.20pm, so of course, After School Club users may use the car park path, but we ask parents and carers to be vigilant of car users and ensure that children are well-supervised.

It was recently brought to our attention that access along the ginnel had become difficult due to thorny branches overhanging the path. We have contacted the council to arrange for these bushes to be properly cut back. In the meantime, we have removed the overhanging thorny branches to improve access. We have also cleared some of the nettles protruding from beneath the hedge along Hornchurch Drive. My apologies for the problems that may have caused.

Extreme Heat

The children have coped incredibly well during this week's extreme heat. As you can imagine, the high temperatures have made conditions in school uncomfortable, but the children have been a real credit to you and to the school.

They have found ways to keep cool, making good use of shaded areas during playtimes and lunchtimes, including the wooded area and gazebos. At lunchtime, Mr Hodge and Mrs Houghton were on hand with a refreshing blast of cold-water spray, which was very much appreciated! Meanwhile, our Nursery children enjoyed a water fight—much to the delight of the children and with Miss Bowler receiving a particularly good soaking. Year 3s enjoyed cooling foot spas! Mrs Wilson also kindly provided ice lollies, which helped everyone cool down.

With a return to more typical summer weather expected next week, children should return to wearing their ties and bring jumpers or fleeces as needed.

Nursery Visit

On Tuesday morning, our Nursery children were treated to a very special visit from a local farmer and some of her young animals. The children met a beautiful young calf, three lambs, some playful young goats and some lovely rabbits.

The farmer commented that our Nursery class was one of the most engaged, enthusiastic and well-behaved groups she has ever worked with, which was great to hear.

Fortunately, a good area of shade was found to keep both the children and the animals comfortable despite the warm weather. It was a fantastic opportunity for the children to learn more about farm animals through hands-on experience, and one they will remember.

Year 6 Retreat Day at St Joseph's Chorley

On Thursday, our Year 6 class attended a retreat day at St Joseph's in Chorley, joining other Year 6 pupils from Catholic schools across the area. It was a special and inspiring day for all.

The children were led in prayer by the charismatic Fr Frankie and also heard a powerful and inspirational talk from Chris Lubbe, a former bodyguard to Nelson Mandela. Chris shared his experiences and spoke movingly about courage, standing up for what is right, and the importance of forgiveness.

Evie, along with others in Year 6 later wrote to the Headteacher of St Joseph's to express how inspired she felt by Chris's story, particularly his message about bravery and the power of forgiveness. The day concluded with Mass at St Joseph's Church, bringing everyone together in celebration and reflection.

A big thank you to Mrs Douglas, Headteacher of St Joseph's, for organising such a meaningful event and for inviting us to be part of it.

Some other health and safety notices

1. Warton Place. Parents and carers, please do not park cars at the top turning point area of Warton Place. If cars are parked there, it reduces the turning area for vehicles, which in turn can be very dangerous when small children are walking up the ginnel and then the small path into the infant playground.

2. Please can I remind parents and carers that the staff car park is only for staff and disabled users. At busy times for example, the start and end of the school day, if a staff member drives into the car park as somebody else is leaving there is no room to pass. This forces the staff to member to have to reverse back on to Hornchurch Drive, which is not an ideal manoeuvre when children and other cars are nearby.

There are a number of routes into teaching but those who have taken this particular path speak very highly of it.

The teacher-training programme provided by the YSA is for those who want a career in teaching and already have a degree level qualification. The programme lasts for one year and involves two long-term placements in Chorley area primary schools alongside high quality training and support provided by the YSA. At the end of the programme, participants emerge as qualified teachers.

Tax-free childcare

One of our governors shared some information with me a couple of years ago to pass on to parents and carers - here is a reminder, in case your circumstances have changed.:

You can get up to £500 every 3 months (up to £2,000 a year) for each of your children to help with the costs of childcare. This goes up to £1,000 every 3 months if a child is disabled (up to £4,000 a year). For every £8 you pay into this account, the government will pay in £2 to use to pay your provider.

You can get Tax-Free Childcare at the same time as 30 hours free childcare if you're eligible for both. You can use Tax-Free Childcare for: childminders, nurseries and nannies and after school clubs and play schemes. <https://www.gov.uk/tax-free-childcare>

It is great to see most classes improving again this week – well done everyone!

No **100%** attendance this week – **but look how close the race for second place is** – Years 1,2,4 and 5 are separated by only 0.05%!

At primary school, children who have high attendance (95-100% attendance) in Year 6 are 30% more likely to achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths compared to similar pupils who miss just 2-4 weeks of school (90-95% attendance).

No boots please!



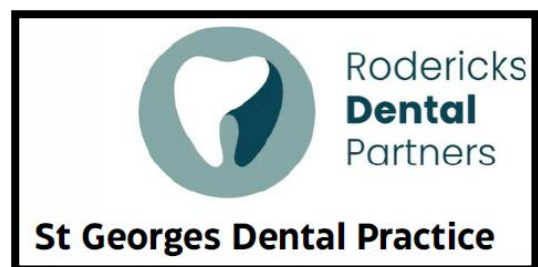
Labelling Uniforms
