# Dear Parents/ Carers

# Welcome back Nursery, Reception and Year 1!

It has been brilliant this week, finally opening the school up for children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and the key worker children. The systems in place all seemed to work, we learned a little each day and made small tweaks along the way. All the classrooms are now in use by 'bubbles,' so the school feels busy and vibrant once again.

It was a great pleasure to see the children so obviously thrilled to be reunited with their friends and to meet some of the familiar adults in school once again. They have knuckled down to learning, adhered to the rules, washed their hands frequently and stayed within their bubbles; they have been excellent and a credit to you.

I would like to thank the parents who have been dropping off and picking up too. Your patience and understanding have been greatly appreciated, as is the way you have also adhered to the guidance. Thank you.

To the children and parents who have not been able to attend school this week, **we have not forgotten about you**! I hope that, in following the guidance provided by the DfE, over the coming weeks, we will be able to welcome everybody back safely in the autumn term – fingers crossed. In the meantime, I would encourage you to stick at your work over the next three weeks, check in with SeeSaw, Tapestry and Class Dojo and do the best you can with it.

In the last week of term we are welcoming back all of Y6. Because there are 32 of them, we will need to split them into three separate bubbles and use the IT room in addition to Y3 and Y4 classrooms. The school will be at full capacity then, so we will be limited on places for additional key worker children. I will give you more information on what this means when I have it.

## What are the plans for a September return for the whole school?

The DfE have informed us that it is their intention that all pupils will go back to school in September. You may have heard talk of bubbles of 30 (double bubbles!) but we have received no information about this yet. The DfE said that it will be releasing further guidance next week and over the coming weeks to assist schools to prepare for a full return. As soon as I know or hear anything, I will let you know.

## **Moving Up and Transition**

You and your children might be keen to know about what the next year in school is going to be like. Usually at the start of July, the teachers would be making sure that the children become familiar with their next year group's rules and routines. The Y6s typically spend a day at their new high school. Here at St Mary's, children would normally have a 'moving-up' session. As you can appreciate, this will be nigh on impossible to do this year, since half of the school are not in attendance and a number of staff are not in either. Therefore, most of this transition and familiarisation work will happen when we all return, hopefully in September.

However, there are some children with special educational needs and/ or disabilities (SEND) who do need particular support in their transition to a new year group before they start it. The SEND team at the local authority have advised us that the transition booklets and information, that would usually be provided for these children and their families, should only be sent out once we are sure of the details for the return for the new school year. This is to avoid creating any unnecessary stress and anxiety for the children; in the event that plans, which are made, subsequently have to be unmade.

Once there is a clear and definite plan in place, for a return to school in September, Mrs Singleton (SENDCO) and the teachers will be in a better position to share transition information with those children and parents who need it. Thank you for your understanding.

#### School uniforms

Some of you might be wondering about school uniforms; we have had one or two queries at the office. Mrs Wilson tells me that we are expecting the delivery of uniforms imminently. Once it has arrived Mrs Wilson and Mrs Hargreaves will send out details of collection times.

#### **SS Peter and Paul**

This Sunday is the Feast of SS Peter and Paul. The children from Years 2 to 6 would normally be attending Mass at St Mary's Church on Monday after. We usually take this opportunity to celebrate Y4's journey of faith during the year, taking part in the Family Catechesis and in receiving the

Sacraments of First Confession and First Holy Communion. On the Monday afternoon, the Y4s would be enjoying a tea party in the school hall and Fr Marsden would bless the gifts that they received at First Holy Communion.

We usually see St Peter with a bunch of keys – the keys to the Kingdom of Heaven. - 4. To log into the app for the first time, select the 3 dots in the top right corner, select 'Account', select 'Voucher codes' and enter your voucher code shown above
