Dear parents/ carers,

This weekend, we will move into the new liturgical year and the season of Advent with this Sunday being the First Sunday of Advent. The season of Christmas is now very much on the horizon and the excitement is clearly building with the children. We all know it is going to be a very different Christmas this year at home for families, in Church and at school. We will, of course, be celebrating the birth of Christ and making it a special time for the children in school.

Open Evening for Prospective Parents

Parental Questionnaire

We are sending out our **annual parental questionnaire** to you this evening via GroupCall. I would be very grateful if you were able to spare a few minutes to have a look at and complete it. Your feedback helps us in our continuing efforts to improve the school for your children and those that attend in the future. This year, perhaps unsurprisingly, there is an additional section regarding COVID.

COVID Control measures –warm clothing

I have mentioned a few times in recent newsletters that one of our control measures, to minimise risk of COVID infection in school, is to maximise ventilation. This means having windows open in classrooms throughout the day. Although the heating remains on in the daytime, it can still get quite cold in the classrooms. I imagine as we head deeper into winter, that this will become the case more and more.

Therefore, from Monday next week, I have told the children that they can bring a jumper or a fleece to wear over the top of their school uniform jumper in class. In order to minimise clothes being

brought backwards and forwards from home to school, this fleece/ jumper should be brought in on Monday and left in class all week ready to take home on Friday.

I would also highly recommend that children wear a vest e.g. thermal vest or long sleeved white/cream top under their shirts too.

In addition, I have made it clear to the children that these warm fleeces/jumpers **are not instead of** uniform just something to put on top of their uniform if they are feeling cold. If they don't want to wear them they do not have to; they can put them on the back of their chairs in class.

Christmas Presents and Christmas Cards

Because of our COVID control measures, I am going to ask parents/ carers and children not to send Christmas gifts or cards into school for children or for staff this year. This is because we want to minimise the transfer of items from home to school and school to home thereby minimising the risk of virus transmission. I am sorry if this is disappointing news for you but I hope you can understand the general principle.

I realise that some parents may have already made some arrangements that they cannot unmake, if this is the case, please contact me at school and we'll see if we can come up with a solution.

2021 SCHOOL ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES - PRIMARY

Nursery Pupils/Primary School Admissions: If your child is in their last year of pre-school/nursery you can now apply for their primary school place at: https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/

It's quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application. The closing date for primary applications for September 2020 is <u>15 January 2021</u>. **Please remember that admissions to St Mary's, or any Catholic primary schools, also require the completion of the separate supplementary information form (SIF).**

Free School Meals – Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants –other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

1. Your child <u>will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6</u> and beyond

2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible?

Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809

It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

- Name
- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone.
