



Attendance News - Unauthorised leave of absence update

We have been advised on a change in the law around penalty charge notice for unauthorised leave of absences e.g. holidays in term time. These changes will come into effect on **19 August 2024.**

• Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19 August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.

- Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice must be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions).
- Only penalty notices issued for absences taking place after 19 August 2024 will count towards the above thresholds.

Foundation Governor role

In the autumn term, the school will have a vacancy on its governing board for a **foundation governor**. Are you interested and keen to make sure children at St Mary's get the best possible education? Are you keen to make sure that the school is helping our children to become followers of Jesus? Are you keen to ensure our school is offering high quality teaching and learning in a safe, happy and Christian environment? If so, you can become a foundation governor. You need to be a practising Catholic who can offer energy, experience and fresh ideas. You need to have interest, enthusiasm and time but do not need to have any particular expertise or special qualifications. Training is offered. School foundation governors are appointed for a term of four years. Governors work as a team to support, challenge and decide what's best for the school, the pupils and staff. They are responsible for how the school performs and for raising standards. Their priorities are to:

- Preserve and develop the religious character of the school
- Maintain and improve standards
- Keep children safe
- Monitor the curriculum
- Plan the school's future direction
- Decide the best way to spend the school budget

The governing board meets once each term with extra meetings to deal with issues like buildings, finance, staffing, standards and effectiveness and school admissions.

Cyberbulllying

We recently received a report based on the health questionnaires that our Y6s completed. The results made for interesting reading and probably reflect the experiences of ten and eleven-year-old children across the country. About half of the children manage to get eight hours or more of sleep each night. Quite a large proportion of children spend more than three hours a day on devices and a large group reported that they have experienced some cyberbullying.

We regularly teach children about cyberbullying and what to do if they experience it. And there is excellent advice for parents about cyberbullying in this month's online safety bulletin (sent out yesterday) attached. The bulletin also covers *TikTok*, talking to strangers online, *Poppy Playtime*, Group Chats and Online Challenges
