Pokémon/Football Cards not allowed in school after Easter

I have 'ummed and ahhed' about Pokémon cards and football cards being brought into school over recent weeks and months. Whilst I have turned a blind eye to them over recent months for the positive reasons outlined above, I have decided that from the start of the summer term children are not to bring Pokémon cards, football cards or the like into school.

Unfortunately, they are causing problems, and increasingly so, with disputes about who owns what card, who swapped what card with who, or even cards that are going missing (some of these cards have eye-wateringly high value) etc. Resolving such disputes can then eat into valuable teaching time and this has become problematic. I know this will disappoint some children but will probably please some parents! Thank you for your support.

The Y5/6 boys' team finished in second place overall and the Y5/6 girls in fifth place out of the twenty-five teams entered. In the Y3/4 races the boys

finished in fourth (originally we thought they had also finished second!) and the girls finished in eleventh place out of twenty-eight teams entered. When all the scores were combined, St Mary's finished in fourth place overall. St Mary's did finish top in one of the events though – apparently, we brought more children for the *fun run* at the end than anyone else!
