At St. Mary's we believe that with the ever changing nature of our world as we know it, socially, economically and environmentally, it's vital that young citizens know their place in the world.

We intend to promote children's interest and understanding about diverse places, people and environments as they develop into active global citizens.

Teaching pupils about global issues is imperative and therefore Mrs Nicklin has recently enabled Chorley St Mary's School to form a link with **Kwa Njena Primary School in Nairobi**, **Kenya** as part of the British Council *Connecting Classrooms* Programme. This programme is taking place in partnership with two other local Chorley Primary Schools.



As part of the project, our Eco-council, alongside some St Mary's International School Ambassadors, will be leading activities across the whole school based on


understand issues of worldwide importance allowing pupils to gain a sense of social responsibility and develop skills to succeed in a global economy.

Their first project will be linked to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly goal 13 – *Climate Change*. The whole school have also taken part in letter writing and artwork based on what their lives are like here for the children in Nairobi to learn more about us.

Later this year, in June, Mrs Nicklin (alongside some other Chorley Deputy Heads) will be representing St Mary's and visiting **Kwa Njena Primary School** in Nairobi for a week to work in their school. Whilst she is there, she intends to blog about what life is like there for the children, provide lessons for both children and teachers and even try to Skype call our children back at St Mary's!

Following on from this, for a week in **November 2020**, it is hoped that the Kenyan teachers will come to visit and teach here at St Mary's and the other Chorley Schools. It is hoped that this partnership will enrich education, promote global citizenship and build international trust and understanding in both schools and societies therefore creating a safer and more connected world for our children's future.

Trip to Chester Zoo – 27th February



Mrs Nicklin has arranged for all the children of Chorley St Marys from Reception to Year 6, to visit Chester Zoo on Thursday 27th February - a visit which will inspire lifelong connections with nature and will help our society move towards a more sustainable future. The children will be immersed in active scientific and geographical learning opportunities such as: conservation, the location of animals, their survival and habitats.

Free School Meals - Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants —other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

- 1. Your child will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 and beyond
- 2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible?

Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809

It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

Name

- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone.
