Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the start of a brand-new school and nursery year at St Mary's. The children all look very smart in their uniforms. They have all settled in very well over the last three days. There have been remarkably few tears in Nursery and Reception; in fact, both groups of children have settled in beautifully.

We welcome especially our new starters (and their mums and dads!) in Reception and Nursery. In addition, we welcome back Jamie in Y3, Isla in Y4 and we welcome Mattia in Y1. We also welcome Mrs Garrett as teaching assistant in Y1 and Mrs Root as teaching assistant in Y4. We hope that they all settle in well and have a happy and memorable time at St Mary's.

#### Start of school year Mass at St Mary's - Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> September at 9am.

Children in Years 3, 5 and 6 will be attending 9.00am Mass at St Mary's **next Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> September at 9am** to celebrate the start of the new school year. We ask that children are dropped off at Church next Wednesday morning from 8.45am where they will be registered by their class teacher. After Mass they will walk back down to school.

#### Y4 Swimming

The Year 4 class will not be going Mass as they will be going to their first swimming lesson. Miss Hesketh will be taking the Y4 class swimming for the first half term. The Y4s need to arrive in class for 8.20 am as they will catch the bus to the pool at 8.30 am.

#### Tuesday 10th September - Y4 Sacramental Programme - Sacramental Cheese & Wine Evening



This year's Sacramental Programme will begin with a Cheese and Wine Evening at school for parents next **Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> September at 6.00pm**. Fr Marsden and Mrs Gray-Grzeczynska, will introduce the programme and explain the process of *Family Catechesis*. The meeting is intended for parents only but if families are struggling for childcare, then the school will do its best to accommodate them.

#### Y1 Parents' Meeting Monday 09.09.19

#### **Reception Phonics/ Reading meeting 11.09.19**

Mrs Singleton is meeting with parents of children in Reception to share information with parents on how children will be learning to read this year and about how we teach phonics in school. Phonics is the learning of letters and sounds to enable children to decode words and to begin to read fluently.

VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application. The closing date for primary applications for September 2020 is 23:59 on 15 January 2020.

### \*\*Please remember that admissions to St Mary's, or any Catholic primary schools, also require the completion of the separate supplementary information form (SIF).\*\*

#### Year 6 Pupils

Secondary school admissions: If your child is in Year 6 you can now apply for their secondary school place at www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools

It's quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application. The closing date for secondary applications for September 2020 is 23:59 on 31 October 2019

#### **Break time snacks**

Children (and staff) do get a bit peckish around about break time and we are happy for them to have a snack. Our policy is for this snack to be toast or a piece of fruit on Monday to Thursday and a snack of their choice on a Friday. The school provides toast which works out at 20p a day on a pre-ordered basis. Alternatively, children may bring in a snack from home. We do ask that all pupils adhere to this rule. <u>Chocolate bars, sweets and crisps are not allowed on Monday to Thursday.</u>

# Some beginning of school year and nursery year reminders

**Earrings and Jewellery -** For safety reasons, earrings are not to be worn in school. If parents wish their children to have their ears pierced then please have them done at the beginning of the six-week break to allow ears to heal. The only form of jewellery children are permitted to wear is watches.

#### Hair styles

We expect pupils to have sensible hair styles. Cuts, dyed hair or styles which in the judgement of the school are extreme, are not acceptable. Please keep the school and nursery a fashion- free zone!



**Shoes** Pupils are expected to wear plain black shoes. Again, we want school to remain a fashion-free zone. Some sports companies make black trainers for children. We ask you not to us these for school. They



are trainers and not shoes and of course the children will prefer to wear them! However, once one has them this puts pressure on the other children to ask their parents for them. Many thanks for your co-operation in this matter.



#### Labelling Uniforms

The children really look smart in their uniforms but so that bits and pieces do not go missing please ensure that **all items** are labelled clearly with your child's name. Thank you. If items do go missing, then the lost property box is available on **Tuesdays** after school by the front entrance.

#### Health and Safety notices

#### Nut allergies



We have a number of children in school who have an allergy to nuts and may experience a severe allergic reaction. We therefore make every effort to be as **nut-free** as possible in school. Therefore, we ask that you do not to send food products into school which may contain nuts. Thank you for your understanding.

#### Grapes in lunch boxes

If your child brings grapes to school either as a snack or as part of their packed lunch, it is very important that they are halved first. This is because whole grapes present a significant risk of choking hazard to children.



#### Parking

By way of a reminder at the start of the school year, I would appreciate your cooperation in parking safely and considerately at drop-off and pick-up times. **Please do** 



not park on the staff carpark, the yellow zig zag lines outside the gates and please do not park across resident's driveways. Thank you.

#### School entrance

At the start and end of the school day there are two entrances to the school in use: Walgarth Drive and Warton Place. The Warton place entrance can also be accessed from Hornchurch Drive via the alleyway that runs parallel to the staff car park. <u>Please do not use the path in the staff car park</u> <u>entrance.</u> This may only be used during the school day when the other entrances are locked.
