# **Phonics success**

We received a letter earlier this week from Nick Gibb, the Minister of State for School Standards.

# Dear Mr Smyth,

I would like to congratulate you, your staff and your pupils on your school's outstanding achievements in the 2019 phonics screening check. Your excellent teaching of phonics is something I hope to see replicated across the country: decoding skills are the foundations for pupils to progress to reading fluently, for purpose and for enjoyment.

The 97% pass rate in Y1 in June put St Mary's in the top 5% of schools nationally. Congratulations to the children on their hard work and excellent attitude in learning phonics, well done to the staff for their excellent teaching and well done to the parents for their support. I've attached the letter at the end for you to read for yourselves.

# **Phonics Sessions for Parents**

This week the Nursery and Reception classes put on phonics lessons for parents of children in the early years classes to watch and find out how their children are learning about letters and sounds. I hope those parents found it of benefit and thank you for the great turn out and support. Thank you to Mrs Singleton, Mrs Cassidy, Mrs Swarbrick and Mrs Bowler for all your hard work too.

# General Election 12<sup>th</sup> December 2020

As you are probably aware, St Mary's school is designated as a polling station for elections and we've had two already this year. On a few occasions in the past we have kept the school open for children, but we found that having the school open to the public all day presents a significant safeguarding risk. So, if there is to be polling in Chorley, the school will close to pupils on the 12<sup>th</sup> December.

I say '*if there to be polling*' because you may also be aware that the Chorley MP, Sir Lindsay Hoyle was elected Speaker of the House of Commons earlier this week. Traditionally, the Speaker's seat remains uncontested. If this is to be the case, there will be no polling in Chorley and the school will remain open. Chorley Borough Council will know by next Thursday afternoon whether or not there will be polling in Chorley.

In summary, if there is polling in Chorley, the school will be closed to children on 12<sup>th</sup> December. If there is no polling in Chorley the school will be open to children as normal on the 12<sup>th</sup> December. We will find out the answer to this question next Thursday and I will let you know next Friday.

We do ask that all pupils adhere to this rule. <u>Chocolate bars, sweets and crisps are not allowed on Monday to Thursday.</u>
