Welcome/Introductions

Jeni welcomed everyone and explained that at St Mary's all parents are automatically considered to be members of the PTFA and the school rely on them for their support in raising funds. PTFA funds are used to support a wide variety of school activities including author visits, coaches for the Christmas pantomime etc. £2,000 is transferred directly to school funds each year. In addition to fundraising the social aspect of all we do in the PTFA is also very important.

A range of potential events were suggested and discussed. These included:

It was acknowledged that the two fairs and the Ladies Night are the most significant in terms of fundraising in the PTFA calendar and the tombola and raffles are the main "money spinners". Some of these suggestions could potentially be incorporated into existing events e.g. secondhand toy stall at the Summer Fair or explored by sub-committees as standalone events in the future. The PTFA is always mindful of the busy school calendar and other demands on parental resources, for example our Good Shepherd events etc.

Key events including Ladies Night and the Summer Fair would be discussed and confirmed after Christmas.
