Daily dough disco to build fingers and arm strength.

In PE we will be: continuing with fundamental skills:
Throwing under arm, rolling a ball, jumping and landing appropriately,
performing a variety of gymnastic rolls, climbing up and down apparatus
using alternative feet and revising fundamental movement skills.



### **Mathematics**

Consolidate learning on number 1
Look at number 2 and begin to subitise numbers
Begin to count in order and with one to one
correspondence (touching an item while saying a
number name).

Beginning to recognise numerals and match them to amounts.

Begin to learn that numbers are made up of smaller numbers.

Key vocabulary – Number, 5 frame, 1, 2, dots, bigger, smaller, count, first, second, how many altogether?

### Patterns:

Begin to create spatial patterns showing organisation. Explore patterns with 2 to 3 objects.

Begin to talk about patterns and identifying patterns.
Complete a simple pattern
