Topic

Our main text for this half term is 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' by Sarah Roberts and Look What I found at the Seaside by Moira Butterfield. Other texts your child will explore are Somebody Crunched Colin by Sarah Roberts, The unexpected visitor by Jessica Courtney Tickle and Michael Recycle by Ellie Bethel. We will also be looking at lots of non-fiction including, Ten things I can do to help my world by Melanie Walsh and The Brilliant recycling project book by Sarah Stanford

In the Early Years, planning from your child's interest is paramount for their development and enjoyment of each topic. To help with this we have included with this curriculum letter a 'planning map' for you to complete with your child. In the centre you will see our topic for this half term. Please can we ask you to have a short discussion with your child about what they would like to know about the different areas we are going to cover. From this we will then include these ideas in our planning so that your child receives a bespoke curriculum involving home, school and the child in the planning process. Many thanks for completing these for Summer term 1. We were able to weave quite a few ideas of what you child wanted to know into my planning and we asked many questions along the way.

Come and See (RE)



We will start the half term with our 'Friends' topic were children will know and understand that we can make friends and Jesus had good friends. We will also know what Jesus tells us about friendship. Following this our next 'Come and See' topic will be 'Our World'. This topic is all about God's wonderful world.



Vocabulary

Here is a list of Goldilocks words (words that are just right) for your children to learn over this next half term. The words are linked to under the sea/ the seaside kite, pier, pebbles, lifeguard, yacht, seagull, starfish, lighthouse, waves, paddle, deep, shallow. Some extra words (step on words) that you may like to explore are deck chair, Frisbee, windbreak, beach huts, rock pool, punch and Judy, ship-in-a-bottle, frolic, sweltering.

Author of the Half Term

Our Author for Summer Term is Eric Carle! We will be reading lots of stories by Eric Carle and learning one by heart.

A few notices:

- We have a fantastic EYFS team across the Nursery and Reception
 class at St Mary's. In the Reception class there are three adults this
 year Mrs Ainscough & Mrs Cassidy as the class teachers and the
 very experienced and talented Teaching Assistants Mrs Swarbrick.
 Mrs Ainscough will be the Class teacher Monday Thursday and Mrs Cassidy will be the Class
 teacher on Friday.
- All teachers have release time during the week for PPA (planning, preparation & assessment).
 Mrs Cassidy will be covering Mrs Ainscough's PPA time on a Thursday from 1.30 pm. Throughout the week we have small 'key worker' group time with either Mrs Ainscough, Mrs Cassidy or Mrs Swarbrick to sing songs/read stories/ opportunities for speaking and listening and 'Show and tell' including looking at 'magic' moments from home.
- The children will do <u>P.E.</u> every <u>Friday afternoon</u>; please can you make sure your child comes to school in their PE kit every Friday.
- Every day your child has access to a drink of milk after their lunch time. Please can you ensure
 that your child brings in a water bottle filled with water every day for them to access in the
 classroom.
- We offer toast as an additional morning snack which will be incorporated into your child's
 learning each day. The school office will send information out as to when this will be starting
 and you will pay for this termly if you so wish.
- Please can your child bring their reading book into school every Monday as we have a helper to listen to them read, thank you.
- Sun-cream and Sun hats: Hopefully the weather will be on the warmer side this half term. Please can I ask (if you haven't already done so) to ensure your child has sun-cream and a sun hat in school. The sun cream will stay in school but the hat will come home each night to bring back the following day. Please can you ensure your child's name is written on the inside of their hat. Please can you also label their cream. All sun cream will be sent home at the end of the half term. The children are taught to apply their own cream so if you could practice at home the children will be more confident in school.

Outdoor Provision

Each day the children have access to outdoor provision, which can get a little messy and wet. It is important that your child has a waterproof coat and wellies (which are to be left outside the Reception classroom) as we enjoy playing outside - whatever the weather! Please can you ensure that your child's belongings are clearly labelled with their name.

Weekend News

Weekend News will be continued in Summer Term 2 to develop the children's writing skills. Each week your child will be invited to write and draw a picture about what they have been doing at the weekend and outside of school. This will then be shared with the rest of the class during speaking & listening time. It may help your child if you have a brief chat with them about their weekend.

Magic Moments

'Magic Moments' are one way in which you can contribute to your child's learning journey. They are to be completed by an adult when you see your child do something that perhaps you haven't seen before or make you go 'wow' or smile. Please add a photo or comment on Tapestry of your child's magic moment for us to share.

Reading Books and Homework



Please can you ensure that your child brings their reading book and reading record book into school on the day stated below (they have a coloured sticker on their plastic book bag). Their reading book will be changed (if needed) on this day only. Your child should read their book three times. Your child's reading book is important, however, this isn't the only book that they can read (or have a go at reading). Please encourage your child to read other

books at home or in the library. If you wish to do so you can record the other books they are reading into their reading record book too. Homework is given out/uploaded onto Tapestry as and when your child's phonics teacher feels they have new learning to consolidate at home. This may be every day. Please can you upload your completed homework onto Tapestry. Thank you for all your support with homework!
