
Key vocabulary:	
Artist	A person who creates paintings or drawings
Composition	The position and layout of shapes on the paper
Rod Walmsley	Local artist from Chorley who specialises in landscape paintings
Landscape	All the visible features of an area of land, natural surroundings as well as buildings and architecture.
Locational drawing	Drawings or sketches made at a location rather than from a photograph Yellow Figure 1 Green
Wash	An application of watercolour thinned with water, then laid smoothly and evenly across the surface
Watercolour	Paint which is water-soluble and gives a transparent colour
Primary colours	The primary colours are red , yellow and blue . They cannot be made by mixing other colours together.
Secondary colours	Secondary colours are: orange - made by mixing yellow and red. purple - made by mixing blue and red. green - made by mixing blue and yellow.
