## Key knowledge we should know by the end of the unit:

- That Remembrance Day is when people take time to remember those who lost their lives in the WW1 and wars since
- The First World War was from July 1914 – November 1918
- Remembrance Day is held on November 11th and that this is the day that the armistice was signed in 1918.
- Susannah Knight was a local teacher who made 'Golden Books' to act as a memoir for Chorley soldiers who had sacrificed their lives in WWI.
- War memorials can tell us something about who we should remember in our local community.
- Walter Tull was a soldier in WW1, he was the first black soldier to lead white troops into battle.

Walter Tull dies in battle in France.

### Timeline of Events

July – November 1916  
The Battle of the Somme. This battle was one of the deadliest battles of the First World War.

11<sup>th</sup> November 1918  
The armistice is signed, ending the First World War.

11<sup>th</sup> November 1919  
The first Remembrance Day is held.
