#### **Christmas Performances**

Well done to **Year 1 and Year 2** for their Nativity, *The Angel Gets Her Wings* The two classes combined extremely well to tell the story of the birth of Jesus two thousand years ago. They spoke clearly, sang beautifully, acted and danced very well in order to share with us, this special story.

As I said at the end of all the performances, these productions serve as one of the ways in which the children learn the story of the first coming of Christ and they help them prepare for Christmas Day which is now only just over a week away – ten sleeps!

### Junior Christmas Concert Monday 19th December at 6.00pm

The children in the juniors (Y3 to Y6) will be performing their Christmas concert and tableau in Church on the evening of **Monday 19**<sup>th</sup> **December** at <u>6.00pm</u>. Prior to that, they will have one final practice at Church on Monday afternoon. Children will walk up to Church after lunch and then will walk back to school for home time.



Check out Class Dojo because a couple of classes would appreciate parent volunteers to accompany us on the walk to and from Church on Monday afternoon. If you can help, that would be brilliant. I believe Y3 and Y4 still need some volunteers.

**On Monday evening,** we would like all the children to meet in the Church. We would like all children to arrive no earlier than **5.45pm** and no later than **5.50pm**. We would like the Y4s to arrive wearing their costumes to save time on getting changed in Church and to allow for a prompt start at 6pm. Parents/ carers can come into Church with their children when they arrive; they do not need to wait outside as in previous years.

Children must wear full uniform and look smart please - coats and other belongings to be left with parents, please.

The concert will start at 6.00pm and the performance will last between 40 minutes and an hour at the most. There will be a collection at the end to contribute to the Church's heating costs for the evening. Father Marsden estimates the cost of heating the Church is about £10 an hour and to get it warmed up for 6pm, the heating has to be switched on at 1pm!

It will be the first such performance since Christmas 2019. It should be a lovely evening, if previous years' events are anything to go by.

#### <u>PRIMARY</u>

Nursery/ pre-school children – due to start Reception class in primary school in September 2023 The statutory closing date is 15 January 2023 – just over four weeks away.

The application can be made using this direct link:

https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/starting-primary-school/

School places are not allocated on a first come, first served basis. All applications received up to the closing date are given equal priority, but if you miss the deadline, a late application may reduce your chance of getting your preference of school.

The arrangements for the admission of pupils to primary schools in September 2023 will, as far as possible, conform to the following timetable.

15 January 2023 - National closing date for primary applications (statutory).

During this period all applications are processed and all preferences are considered against the published admissions policy. Where there are more applications than places available, decisions are made as to which children should be offered the available places. LCC will liaise and exchange information with all other admission authorities including neighbouring local authorities. The allocation and offer of a primary school place is finalised.

17 April 2023 - Offers issued to parents\*

(The national offer date is 16 April, if this date falls on a weekend or a bank holiday, offers are sent the next working day.)

28 April 2023 - Deadline for requesting:

- an appeal
- a place on the reserve (waiting) list(s)
- Week commencing 1 May 2023 Distribute appeal forms to parents

By 7 July 2023

# Health and Safety Reminder – sickness and/ or diarrhoea

This is the time of year when there are more bugs and germs around than usual. If your child does become ill with **sickness or diarrhoea**, the guidance for schools from Public Health England gives a minimum recommended absence from school of 48 **hours**. This is to limit the spread of the bug around school. Thank you.



## **Strep A/ Scarlet Fever**

# What are the symptoms of Strep A/scarlet fever?

Strep A infections can cause a range of symptoms that parents should be aware of, including:

- Sore throat
- Headache
- Fever
- A fine, pinkish or red body rash with a sandpapery feel
- On darker skin the rash can be more difficult to detect visually but will have a sandpapery feel

If a child becomes unwell with these symptoms, please advise parents to contact their GP practice or contact NHS 111 (which operates a 24/7 service) to seek advice.

If a child has scarlet fever, advise they stay at home until at least 24 hours after the start of antibiotic treatment to avoid spreading the infection to others.

Parents/ Carers should trust their own judgement and if their child seems seriously unwell call 999 or go to A&E if:

- a child is having difficulty breathing you may notice grunting noises or their tummy sucking under their ribs
- there are pauses when a child breathes
- a child's skin, tongue or lips are blue
- a child is floppy and will not wake up or stay awake.

# How to help prevent Strep A?

To prevent the spread of Strep A, UKHSA advises children, young people and staff to implement good hand and respiratory hygiene practices.
