Impact on pupils' participation:	<p>2021/22 was a successful year encapsulated by our all singing and dancing health week, amazing whole-school trips (over x2 days) to Chill Factor-e and success with our school football team (Chorley league and cup double winners).</p> <p>Whilst our participation in CSSP competitions was still slightly down based upon our pre-covid data, we still met the criteria to achieve the Sainsbury's National GOLD Kitemark award.</p>
Impact on pupils' attainment:	<p>The introduction of the Lancashire PE APP has helped with attainment, plugging gaps and identifying groups (above and below).</p> <p>Diane Moss (from Holy Cross) continued to do transition work, using the Lancs PE APP with x3 classes over x3 half-terms (Autumn 1 – Spring 2).</p>
How the premium has allowed pupils to develop active lifestyles:	<p>Pupil attitude questionnaires and the pupil interviews during this academic year highlighted how happy the children were with the PE and School sport that the school offers. The highlight of the year was the Chill Factor-e trip for many pupils. Pupils highlighted to me that they felt as though they had a voice by being able to make suggestions to the PESG and that these would be implemented.</p>
How the school will sustain the improvements:	<p>We re-visit the Action Plan each term, monitor the impact of the funding (on pupil participation and attitudes – yearly and staff skills via an audit (bi-annually)), set yearly targets and strive to ensure that these targets are met.</p>
