Child Protection

One of the most important roles that we have in school is that of keeping your children safe. Each school is required to have a **designated safeguarding lead (DSL)**. At St Mary's I am the main DSL and Mrs Nicklin is the back-up DSL. Yesterday I attended refresher DSL training and as a result, I have updated the 2019/ 2020 Child Protection Policy with one or two additional items. I would recommend you having a read of it and if you have any thoughts on it contact me via the school office. Why do we have a policy?

The purpose of the safeguarding policy is to ensure every child who is a registered pupil at our school is safe and protected from harm. This means we will always work to:

- Protect children and young people at our school from maltreatment;
- Prevent impairment of our children's and young people's health or development;
- Ensure that children and young people at our school grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care;
- Undertake that role so as to enable children at our school to have the best outcomes.

Safer Internet Day /Whatsapp Groups/ Please do not allow children to set up or be involved in Whatsapp groups.

Next Tuesday 11th February is National Safer Internet Day. Keeping safe online is part of our all year round curriculum but on Tuesday we will have a special focus on online safety and a special assembly. As part of this I will be talking about social messaging. One of these social media messaging app platforms that many of us use is *Whatsapp*.

It might surprise you to learn (it surprised me!) that the minimum age for *Whatsapp* is 16 in the UK https://faq.whatsapp.com/en/iphone/26000151/. Whatsapp is a great way of communicating with each other and many of us as families use it and on the whole it's harmless- however it is not designed to be used by primary school children.

It's come to my attention, as these things do, that a number of Y6s are using *Whatsapp*. The problem with this is that it opens up opportunities for misuse. E.g one person has the power over who to include, exclude or 'kick out' members of the group. As you can imagine this can bring problems into school such as online bullying. Nothing like that has been reported to me yet but you can see that the potential is there. I therefore respectfully ask that you do not allow your children to set up or be involved in *Whatsapp* groups.

KS1 and KS2 SATs meeting – Wednesday 12th February – 6.00pm Y2 and 6.30pm Y6

We have organised short sessions on Wednesday next week for parents of children in Y2 (6.00pm) and Y6 (6.30pm). Mrs Nicklin and Mr Cahalin will be talking to parents about the national curriculum assessments (SATs) that they will be participating in later in the year. In addition, Mr Cahalin will use the meeting to share information about the forthcoming Y6 residential to Hothersall.

Free School Meals - Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants —other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

- 1. Your child will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 and beyond
- 2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible?

Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809** It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

- Name
- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone.
