Shrove Tuesday

Ash Wednesday and Lent

 The first Wednesday after the holiday (**26th February**) is Ash Wednesday, marking the beginning of the season of Lent. Children in **Y3, Y4, Y5** and **Y6** will be going to Mass at St Mary's, so we ask that the children are dropped off at Church from **8.45am at the earliest** where they will be registered. Children in the Breakfast Club will walk up to Church with staff from school. At the end of Mass, the children will walk back down from Church to school in time for morning break.

Lent also heralds the arrival of the Nugent Care 'Good Shepherd Appeal,' which the children love to get involved in and culminates in the famous Good Shepherd Talent Show.

On Thursday 27th February, it's the whole school trip to Chester Zoo as mentioned in the newsletter a couple of weeks ago and while the rest of the school are away the nursery class are being visited by a double decker bus!

World Book Day March 5th 2020

This year for World Book Day on March 5th, as part of our **vocabulary** push we would like children to dress up as '**advanced words**.' What does that mean? It means, for example, that they could dress up as a cat and be a **feline** or they could dress in bright colours and be **fluorescent**. The children can dress up either just with a prop, or a complete outfit - the choice is yours.

The children must know the **advanced word** they are dressed up as (perhaps this could be written down for them or on a label). It is hoped this day will boost the enjoyment of reading but also enhance children's and adults' vocabulary!

As it happens, I learned a new word today from Ella in Y6, who used the word **claying** in her writing today. Definition: *claying (adjective), meaning too sweet* – I don't know how you would dress up for that word though!

Miss Hesketh has arranged for the Footlights Theatre company to come into school during the morning to perform to EYFS, KS1 and KS2. We hope the children have a great day and enjoy celebrating all of the amazing vocabulary we access through the wondrous world of books.

Safer Internet Day 11th February

Children learn about how they can stay safe online as part of the school curriculum but each year we join in with this national awareness raising day. This year we looked at the benefits and fun that can be had with an online identity but we also looked at how that can be done with consideration and safety.

Please do not allow children to set up or be involved in Whatsapp groups.

It might surprise you to learn (it surprised me!) that the minimum age for *Whatsapp* is 16 in the UK <https://faq.whatsapp.com/en/iphone/26000151/>. *Whatsapp* is a great way for us to communicate with each other, many of us, as families, use it and on the whole it's harmless – however, it is not designed to be used by primary school children.

It's come to my attention, as these things do, that a number of Y6s are using *Whatsapp*. The problem with this is that it opens up opportunities for misuse. E.g one person has the power over who to include, exclude or 'kick out' members of the group. As you can imagine

this can bring problems into school such as online bullying. Nothing like that has been reported to me yet but you can see that the potential is there. I therefore respectfully ask that you do not allow your children to set up or be involved in *Whatsapp* groups.

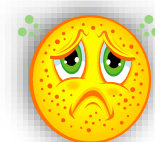

Free School Meals – Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants – other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

1. Your child will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 and beyond

2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible?

Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809**

It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

- Name
- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone.
