Tax-free childcare

In case you missed this just before half term – a final reminder ... one of our governors shared some information with me to pass on:

You can get up to ± 500 every 3 months (up to $\pm 2,000$ a year) for each of your children to help with the costs of childcare. This goes up to $\pm 1,000$ every 3 months if a child is disabled (up to $\pm 4,000$ a year). For every ± 8 you pay into this account, the government will pay in ± 2 to use to pay your provider.

You can get Tax-Free Childcare at the same time as 30 hours free childcare if you're eligible for both. You can use Tax-Free Childcare for: childminders, nurseries and nannies and after school clubs and play schemes.

2024 SCHOOL ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES - PRIMARY

Primary School Admissions September 2024: If your child is in their last year of pre-school/nursery you can now apply for their primary school place at: <u>https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/starting-primary-school/</u> for a September 2024 start.

It is quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. **VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in a school**. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

School places are not allocated on a first come, first served basis. All applications received up to the closing date are given equal priority, but if you miss the deadline, a late application may reduce your chance of getting your preference of school. The national closing date for primary applications is **15 January 2024**. Between now and 15th January all applications are processed and all preferences are considered against the school's published admissions policy for school year 2024 – 2025 https://www.chorleystmarys.lancs.sch.uk/our-school/admissions
