SAD RESULTS OF THE ABORTION ACT 1967 — which was sponsored by David Steel MP. It came into effect on 27<sup>th</sup> April 1968. Abortion numbers have recently increased by 4,000. In 2020 **210,860 abortions took place in which 209,917 were for residents in England and Wales.** The North West has the highest abortion rate with the South West the lowest. 81% of abortions were given to single women and 51% to women who stated that they had a partner (not necessarily married). 42% of women had a repeated abortion. 3,370 abortions took place on grounds of disability: 859 babies with Down Syndrome and 40 babies with cleft palate. Please support petitions that are Pro Life. These figures are very high and extremely sad. Joe Bury has a anti-abortion petition in the narthex. You may wish to sign it. Thank you.
