FOR YOUR INFORMATION: For the month of August, the electricity bill for the church was £594.59. Therefore, we are now implementing plans which will hopefully reduce the monthly electric bill. The church lights will only go on 10 minutes before Mass commences. Lights need to be turned off immediately at the end of Mass. The weather is cooling down. We make the sign of peace during Mass by bowing or waving. Please remember the one-way system to receive Holy Communion. It does make sense not to bump into each other. The Eucharist is to be received into your hands and not on your tongue. Thank you very much.

WHY DO WE HAVE PIOUS LISTS/ NOVEMBER LISTS? Traditionally November is a



month for remembering our loved ones who have left this earthly life and gone to meet Jesus Christ. We commemorate All Saints on 1st November followed next day by All Souls. November is a special month of prayer for the deceased.

Some people die as perfect saints, but many do not. They need to make reparation to Jesus for their sins, and to be purified, because nothing blemished can enter heaven. We can

help them through this process by offering up our prayers and penances. The pains of sickness and death itself can be a part of our purgation.

In many countries around the world, families ask for Holy Mass to be offered for the repose of the souls of their loved ones. We offer Mass each day in November for all those on the November Pious List. You can add your loved ones to this list by using the envelopes provided in a basket at the back of the church.

We also ask you to include a donation for the Masses. On All Souls' Day, Dcn Norman leads the procession in Chorley Cemetery where we pray for the names on your family and friends' gravestones. If your loved ones are already in heaven, God will use your prayers for somebody else in need, perhaps those who had no relatives or friends, the lost ones, and the forgotten ones. Please remember to pray for all the priests that have served this parish, altar servers, housekeepers, cleaners, secretaries, gardeners and teachers in our school. Also, for the brave men and women who served in the Armed Forces for our freedom. Thank you.
