SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT - REFLECTION



We are invited today to listen to the beloved Son, as the Father has instructed: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." Listening is different than hearing. We may hear different things or voices around us, but to listen is to be very attentive to what God is saving and living it out in our lives. This is being open to God's word, by having our minds and heart shaped by it, and living it out. By listening to His Word, we are nourished spiritually, made pure or whole, so that we may rejoice in beholding God's glory. Through partaking in the mystery of the Eucharist, we are partaking of the things of heaven, we partake in His divine life. The Transfiguration is the
