

<u>UKRAINE</u>: Thanks to the generosity of parishioners during the last few months, here at St Mary's, at St Joseph's Anderton, and at St Joseph's Withnell, last Tuesday I was able to send out the sum of £7400 to Bishop Hryhoriy Komar in Drohobych for humanitarian and medical help for refugees from the fighting and bombing in the east of the country. The money arrived safely later that day.

Bishop Hryhoriy's diocese of Drohobych and its parishes are housing thousands of refugees from the Russian invasion. There are many injured soldiers in their hospitals. Food and medicine are costly, and the Ukrainian Government can give the Church no help, because all its funds are expended on the war effort. Some funds also go to buy fuel for the trucks which ferry humanitarian aid coming in at the Polish border, to people in the danger zones of Donetsk, Zaporizhzhya and Kherson oblasts. The seminary students help in transshipping these supplies. Our Archdiocese is also sending out more trucks in early May. I would urge you not to forget this is still an urgent and difficult situation, but to keep on being generous. There is a basket for donations at the back of church after each Mass.
