"RENDER UNTO CAESAR WHAT IS CAESAR'S AND UNTO GOD WHAT BELONGS TO GOD" is a well-known quotation from Matthew 22:21 and is part of Jesus' response to a joint attempt by the Herodians and Pharisees to make him stumble publicly.

Caesar minted coins, as he had a right to do, and he demanded some coins in return, taxes, as was his right. After all, his image was stamped on what he had made. God has "minted" the human soul, and He has stamped His image on every one of us (Genesis 1:27). The lesson is then to give Caesar his due—the temporary taxes and civic duties—but make sure to give God His due: "Offer yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life; and offer every part of yourself to him as an instrument of righteousness" (Romans 6:13).

Christianity sees the Church and the State as two separate authorities, the Church spiritual, and the rulers of this world, temporal. The State has its own sphere of influence and control, organizing life towards the common good, but must respect the spiritual sphere and fundamental human rights. No political leader has the right to claim absolute, unconditional allegiance from the people, because they are ultimately God's creatures, not his. Terrible evils have arisen where totalitarian leaders take over a country. Certain religions try to build a theocracy, where the clerics rule every detail of everyday life as well, as we see in Iran and Saudi-Arabia.
