Jesus said to his disciples, 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the marketplace and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So, they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same.

Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too."

In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said, "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat."

He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus, the last will be first, and the first, last.' Matthew 20:1-16

ON HUMAN WORK: Pope St John Paul II, Karol Wojtyła When the Nazis invaded Poland in September 1939, Karol Jozef Wojtyła (aged 19) and his father fled Wadowice, their home town near Kraków, but soon returned, having learnt that the Russians too, allied with the Nazis, had invaded Poland from the east. In Kraków the University was shut down. For the next four years, avoiding arrest and deportation, Karol Wojtyła worked in a stone quarry, then in the Solvay chemical factory. Wojtyła was the first pope to have been a manual labourer since St Pontian died in the salt mines of Sardinia in 235 AD.

After becoming Pope in 1978, he published his Encyclical Laborem Exercens (On Human Work) in 1981. He set forth the following basic priorities for discussing work and labour issues:

- Labour takes precedence over capital.
- People are more important than things.
- Human work and rest are a sharing in the activity of God, the Creator.
- Work is following in the footsteps of Jesus, a carpenter, and the Apostle Paul, a tentmaker. Many other examples of various occupations are given in the Old and New Testaments.
- "By enduring the toil of work in union with Christ crucified for us, man in a way collaborates with the Son of God for the redemption of humanity."

John Paul also predicted that the increased use of technology, especially information technology, would bring changes comparable to the industrial revolution of the previous century. Some resources, particularly oil, were becoming scarce. The need to protect the environment was becoming apparent. **Forty years ago**!
