- The children's reading level has been sent on SeeSaw. Once they have finished reading their book online please ensure they write a note on Seesaw and put this in the Reading Book folder each time you have finished a book, you can do this for both your Oxford reading books and any other books you are currently reading at home. I would expect the children to read one book a week or one over two weeks along with their own book for pleasure whilst at home. We only have access to roughly four titles per reading level as ebooks. The children can choose which order they read these books in and if they have already read one of the books they do not have to read it again.
- We will continue to monitor and record your child's progress in our records. Please ensure you also ask them questions throughout or at the end for understanding whenever possible. There is often questions at the beginning and end of most of the books which are really useful.
