Key dates

350AD Anglo Saxons land on English shores but are defeated by the resident Roman army.

410AD Romans leave England.

449-550AD arrival of Jutes from Jutland, Angles from Denmark and Saxons from Germany who settle in Kent.

617AD Northumbria becomes the Supreme Kingdom.

779AD Mercia becomes the Supreme Kingdom after Offa builds a dyke along the Welsh border.

1066AD The last Anglo Saxon King Harold died at the Battle of Hastings and William of Normandy was crowned King.

Saxons	German – Dutch tribes who settled in Britain from around 450 AD.
Scots	People from Ireland, who, like the Picts, were fierce and powerful fighters.
