**Year 6 Remote Learning Timetable and Overview**



**English:**

Gathering content for our own detective stories. This week we will begin to draw together some ideas for our own detective stories. We will look at characters (the detective, sidekicks and suspects) and the plot (including red herrings).

Please note that Thursday is World Book Day and we will theme the day's work around this.

**Grammar/Spellings:**

There will be a spelling test on Friday (05/03/21)

This week we will focus on the use of Semi-colons.

**Reading:**

Reading will take place using the oxford owls ebook library <https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/>

We now have a paid for version of the Oxford Owl ebooks so there are lots more books on there in each level. If your child read all the books from their level (and the levels above) could they please go back to their initial level and read the books that have been added.

To access these new books I had to create a new account for the children. I tried to keep the username similar to the old one and the password is the same.

All the pages needed for the comprehension activities will be provided with the tasks.

**Maths:**

Our maths focus for the week will be on mental and written addition and subtraction. We will:

- Add and subtract whole numbers and decimals using formal written methods (columnar addition and subtraction).
- Solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why.
- Choose an appropriate strategy to solve a calculation based upon the numbers involved.

**Science:**

Classification

We will research the famous scientist Carl Linnaeus, a pioneer of classification.

**History:**

Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England. This week we will consider these questions:

- What was life like during Anglo Saxon times?
- How was Anglo Saxon society structured?

**Live Lesson:**

- We will continue to use the live lessons to support the work in Mathematics (9:30am). The lesson will consist of an overview of the day's work (15 mins) followed by a 30-45 minute maths lesson. There may be follow up work for the children to complete independently after the session.  
**There will be no live lesson on Friday as I will be in school preparing for the wider reopening of school.**

### World Book Day

As Thursday is World Book Day there will be some different activities to celebrate books and reading for pleasure. We have purchased a production by a theatre group who usually come into school, The Footlights Theatre Company. Links for this will be sent closer to the day.
